

Up at the Community Building on Easter Saturday.....







2021/2022 Leona Valley Gymkhana Queen Pageant Cancelled

The Leona Valley Gymkhana Queen Pageant Committee in Board has voted to cancel the 2021/2022 Gymkhana Queen conjunction with the Leona Valley Improvement Association, formally announces that the LV Gymkhana Queen Pageant, previously scheduled for Oct. 16 and 17th, 2021, has been cancelled due to the impact of COVID-19.

For the past year, the health and safety of our current queens, incoming contestants, committee members, volunteers, clinicians, donors and sponsors have been our priority. Until recently-due to L.A. County guidelines—we have not been able to effectively plan for the current pageant. Although we extended the qualifying gymkhana requirements, most of our Gymkhana Play Days have been cancelled and it has not been possible to schedule clinics. More importantly, we rely heavily on sponsorships and donations, and the Pageant Committee feels it is not appropriate to ask for either since most businesses have struggled during this past year. 

Notes from Miss Celleanous

Things have changed a bit since we moved to Leona Valley in 1961. My husband, Don, drove to work at Bendix Corp. in Sylmar, traveling Bouquet Canyon or Old Sierra Hwy. There was no freeway then. We had a two and a half year old son, Jack, and I was pregnant with our second son, Tom. Because our home was on the north side of Elizabeth Lake Road our mailing address was Palmdale. Addresses for homes on the south side of Elizabeth Lake Road were Saugus. Those of us who lived on Elizabeth Lake Rd. between Bouquet Canyon and 90th St. W. got two mail deliveries a day, one from Palmdale and one from Saugus. However, it didn't stop there. My friend, Dorothy Lugo, who lived across the valley on Leona Ave. was also pregnant. We both went into labor at about the same time. After our boys were born, Dorothy and her husband, George, came into my hospital room to visit with me and my husband. During our conversation we discovered that their hospital bill was higher than ours. Upon questioning hospital staff, we discovered that because their address was Saugus, they lived outside of our hospital district and therefore were charged more.

For many years I had thought that the name Leona was for a female lion. Leo for male lion - Leona for female lion. Not so according to some of the old timers. The valley was originally named for Col. Leonis of the U.S. Cavalry, but the map maker did not make a legible letter "s" which was later mistaken to be an "a." I'm not sure how much of this is true, but it makes a good story. (Editor's note: good story but not true.)

Way back in the olden days, of the mid 60's, Leona Valley had an annual 4th of July picnic across from where Godde Hill Rd. joined Elizabeth Lk. Rd. Everyone joined in. My husband and I helped our Cub Scouts man the snow cone machine. As always the food was good and we all had fun.

Years have passed. A slab, a deep pit Bar-B-Que and lights have all been added, but the Leona Valley Spirit has not changed. Leona Valley is still beautiful, neighbors still watch out for neighbors and people still enjoy the simple pleasures of enjoying time with family, and friends.

Calabacitas

Here is a good recipe for when the zucchini starts to take over the garden. It's very common in Mexico and everyone has their own version. It's a very flexible recipe. Use whatever you have on hand and make it as spicy (or not) as you desire. It's good on it's own or it can be used as a filling for tacos, enchiladas or burritos. Add chicken, pork or beef if you choose.

1 onion, chopped

2 or 3 zucchinis and/or yellow squash, depending on size, chopped

3 cloves of garlic, minced

Chilis, fresh or canned, hot or mild

3 tomatoes or 1 small can

1 can of corn or fresh from cob

1 tsp. oregano

salt and pepper to taste



Saute onion in oil until transparent, add zucchini, garlic, chilis, and tomatoes. Cook over medium heat until zucchini is almost tender, then add corn and seasonings. Garnish with cotija cheese (or shredded cheddar), salsa, green onions, lime juice, and/or cilantro.

LV Racketteers 4-H Club to Hold their Memorial Day Service


