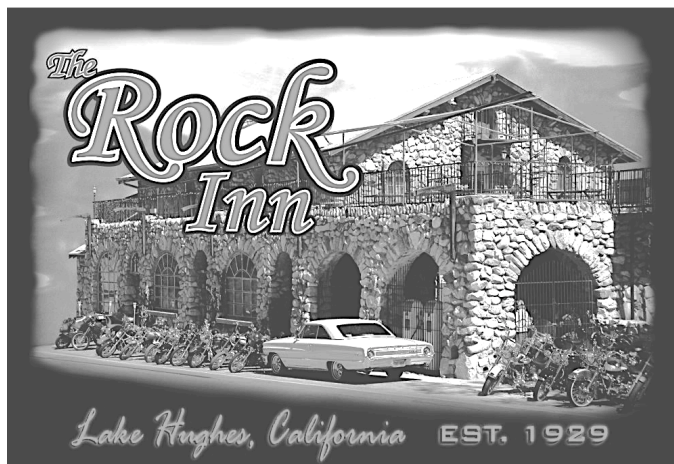

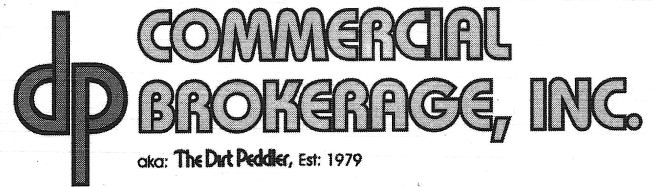
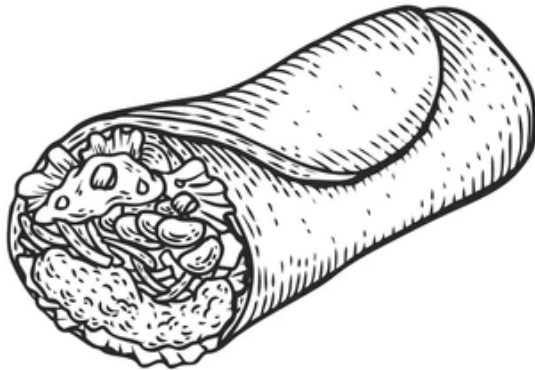
carry a flashlight. The way the wind has been blowing lately this power outage thing might happen again.

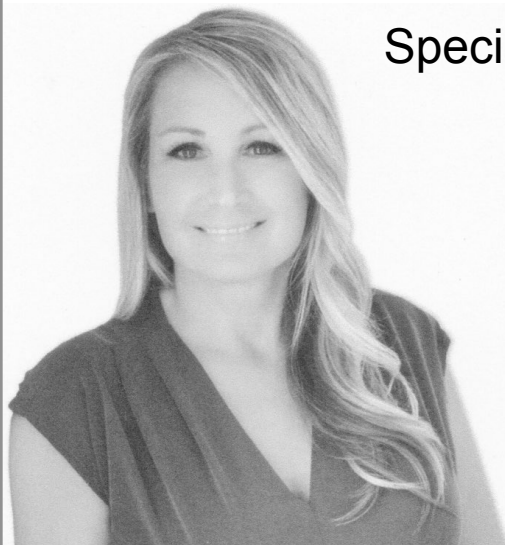

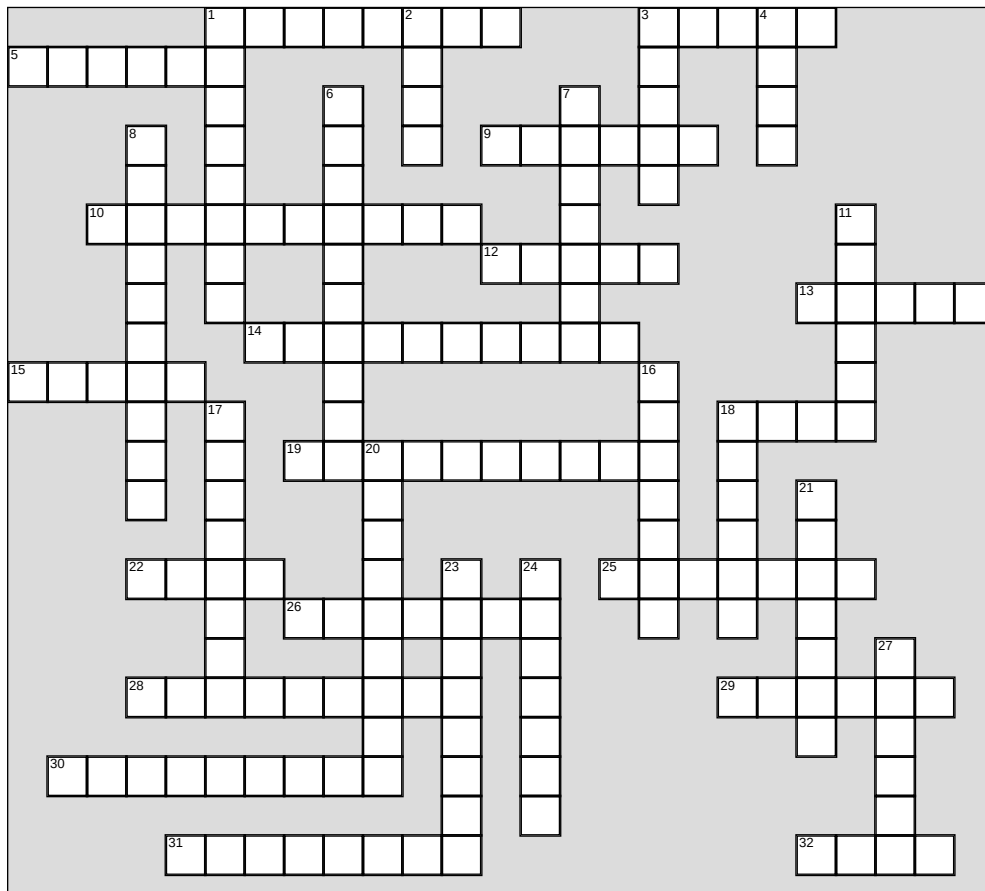

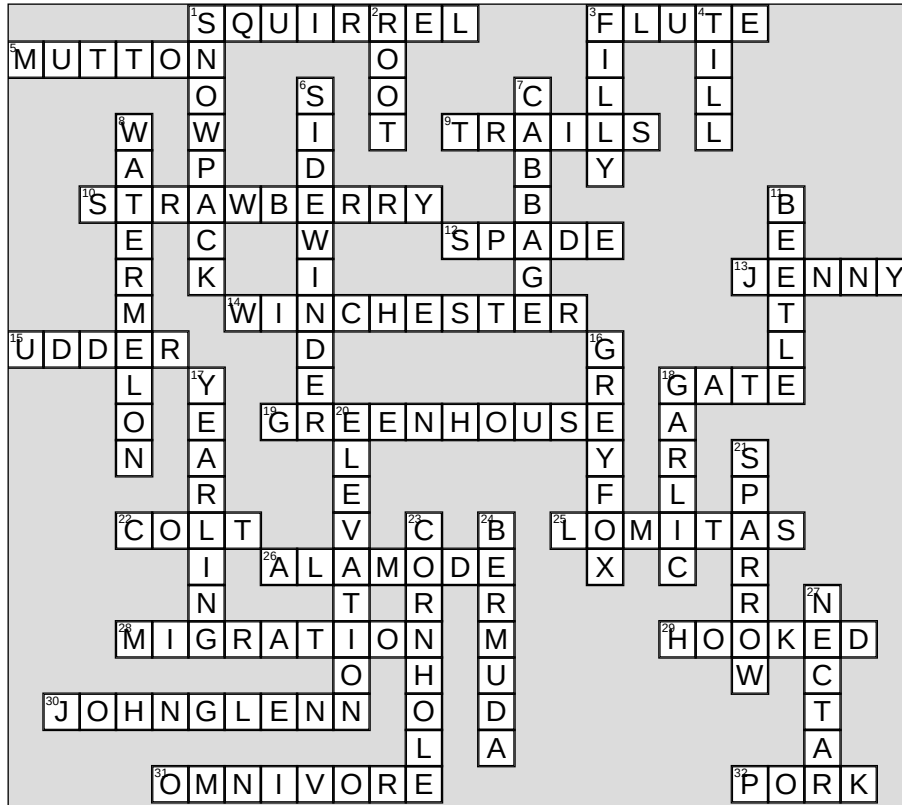
