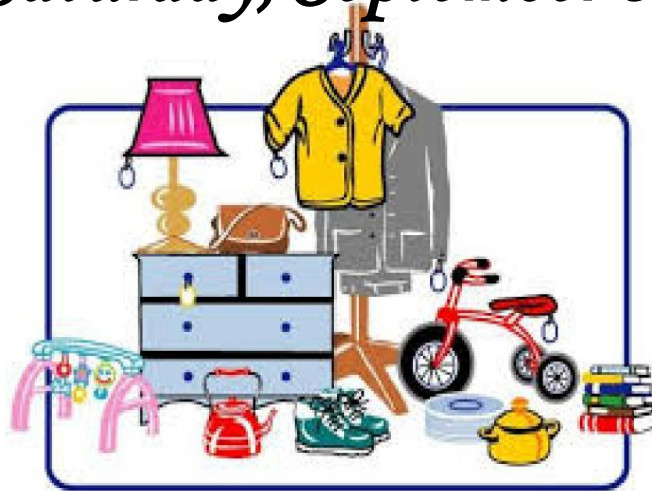

LVIA provides free recycling services to all residents with multiple Waste Management bins located on the Community Building property. Flex Alerts or Public Safety Power Shutoffs

Southern California is no stranger to summer heat, but when temperatures soar into the triple digits, our electrical grid is placed under tremendous strain. During periods of extreme demand, Southern California Edison may issue Flex Alerts or Public Safety Power Shutoffs to help reduce the risk of equipment failures and wildfires.

Here are a few simple ways to help keep your family comfortable and safe if the lights go out:

Stay Hydrated: Drink water regularly, even if you don't feel thirsty. Avoid excessive alcohol, sugary drinks, and too much caffeine, as they can contribute to dehydration.

Keep the Heat Out: Close blinds, curtains, doors, and windows during the hottest part of the day. Once temperatures begin to drop in the evening, open doors and windows to encourage natural airflow.

Dress for the Weather: Choose lightweight, loose-fitting light-colored clothing to help your body regulate its temperature more efficiently.

Protect Your Food: Keep the refrigerator and freezer doors closed as much as possible. Every time they're opened, valuable cold air escapes.

Foods That Help Keep You Cool: watermelon, strawberries, blueberries, pineapple, oranges, grapes, cucumbers, lettuce, and other leafy greens. Heavy, greasy meals can make your body work harder, leaving you even hotter. Instead, opt for salads, fresh fruit, smoothies, and wraps.

What About Your Pets?

Our furry family members are just as vulnerable, if not more, to heat. Make sure they have plenty of fresh water, shade, and a cool place to rest. If at all possible, **DO NOT LEAVE YOUR PETS OUTSIDE!**

Check on Others!

Take a few moments to check on elderly or infirm neighbors. They are vulnerable in extreme weather conditions, and they feel like a burden if they ask for help. Please, be that good Samaritan - One day, this could be you!

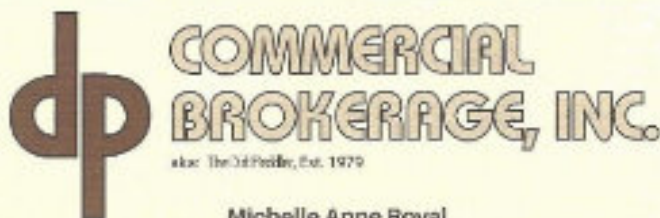
