
LVIA'S FREE SENIOR DINNER AND CRAFT FAIR KEPT US BUSY!



WHY IS MY PROPANE REGULATOR AFFECTED BY COLD WEATHER?

AC Dave Heating & Air wants to bring awareness to potential issues with your propane regulator which could affect your heating, cooking (if you have a propane stove), and hot water. However, unless you own your propane tank, you will need to contact your propane company rather than your HVAC company to resolve these issues.

While the propane does not freeze, the drop in tank temperature can affect pressure levels, potentially causing regulator malfunctions. Propane regulators can be affected by cold weather due to the following reasons: freezing moisture, temperature-related pressure drop, freezing condensation on the regulator, or improper regulator ventilation.

A propane regulator may be experiencing issues if you notice any of the following signs:

Gas leak: A gas leak is the most critical issue with a bad regulator. If you notice an odor around your propane tank, call your propane company!

Low gas pressure: The regulator may not be working properly if you have low gas pressure. The flame on your stove may be low or orange in color.

Unusual sounds: A bad regulator may make a whistling or hissing sound.

Weak flame: The flame on a gas stove may be weak

Visible damage: The regulator may be visibly damaged. Also, look for signs of frost on the regulator.

Slow heat output: The heat output from a gas furnace may be slow

Frost or ice: There may be frost or ice on the regulator. When this occurs, allow a couple of hours for the regulator to thaw, and your regulator will work again.

Tips to Prevent Issues

Keep the regulator dry by installing a cover or shield to protect it from direct exposure to moisture.

You can insulate the tank and regulator by purchasing specifically designed covers for your propane tank. Check with your propane company first.

Check for leaks or moisture.

If possible keep the tank full. A fuller tank maintains higher pressure in cold weather.

If available, use cold-weather propane.

In cold weather, your propane regulator might take several hours to fully warm up or thaw, depending on the severity of the temperature, so just wait for it to heat up.

If you notice any of the above issues, Do Not Call Your HVAC Technician unless you own your tank. Instead, contact your propane company. If you do not own your propane tank. HVAC technicians are not permitted to work on your regulator. For all other heating issues, please call AC Dave Heating & Air: 661-270-1961.
