FROM THE PASTOR: Worship Feedback

Thank you for participating in and offering feedback regarding our summer worship experiment. Comments gathered by the Summer Planning Team are shared below.

Based on the feedback we've received following worship services the last few weeks, as of July 20 the Worship Team has received feedback from 19 people. Comments we heard most often are listed below with the number of people expressing that sentiment in parentheses:

- like having one service and worshiping together (11)
- like the 9:00 a.m. time (3)
- like the physical setup (5)
- like the statement of inclusion (2)
- dislike the two-piece worship bulleting (4)

Other comments, questions, or suggestions:

- Is 9:00 a.m. too early for some?
- passing of collection plates during the offering is a bit confusing
- the physical setup makes it easier to see and hear one another
- different is good once in a while
- requested that we share feedback we receive with the congregation
- service flow is getting smoother
- likes sitting closer together, sense of "worshiping with family"
- need to improve traffic flow during Communion
- Is there too much music in the service for some people?
- wants to see the light carried out at the end of the service (note from Worship Team: this was always the intent and the service has been adjusted to make this work better)

On Sunday, August 4 we will vote as a congregation whether to continue as one service or return to two services. Please note that this vote is only to decide the number of services moving forward. After this decision is made, the Worship Team will then invite survey responses regarding worship time(s), set-up (including pews/chairs), and style(s).

On August 4, paper ballots will be available during worship and in Fellowship Hall following worship. If you are not able to be present on the 4th, please check your email as ballots were emailed on July 25 or contact the church office and Darby will email you a ballot. 

Simplified Board Highlights

The July meeting began with silent prayer. Connie and Valerie shared Affirmation from Annual Conference followed by prayer.

Intentional Discipleship activity centered on pages 38-43. Kristin asked us two questions.

What would be the biggest challenges for us to something like this at Green Street?

- Having enough people to do some of the ideas
- How to know when to let go of some of the things we are doing
- Organization
- Burn out

What would be the greatest blessings?

- Individuals are engaged in a personal way making commitments to things they find inspiring and enjoyable
- Group choices not obligations

VOTE: That the board appoint a Welcoming Task Force to shepherd Green Street through the study and discernment process outlined in the Building an Inclusive Church workbook(rmnetwork.org) to decide whether to become a Reconciling Congregation. 5 Approved – 0 Opposed – 4 Abstained.

VOTE: To establish a separate SPRC Committee with a minimum of five members and a nine member Church Board for 2020. The conference has since decided we developed the simplified board model that the SPRC must be a separate committee from the church board. We will need to have this voted on at Green Street's annual charge conference. All in favor.

VOTE: To approve Sally Joy as liaison to the Nursery Coordinator, to report to the Pastor or SPRC Chair. All in favor.

VOTE: To approve allowing the Pastor to renegotiate the coaching relationship and contract with Beth Estock due to denominational shifts and financial decisions and the ensuing viability study here at Green Street for receiving the best use of this relationship. All in favor.

VOTE: To approve Minutes from the June Board Meeting. All in favor with one spelling correction on page 15 "Connie made a motion to accept (not except) the Buildings and Grounds Use Policy" 7 approved, 2 Abstained.

Information regarding this year's finances

The finance task force has analyzed income and expenses for the remainder of the year based on actual numbers from the first half of this year and the last half of 2018. They made their best estimates for monthly cash flow from July to December including a loan of \$2,000 from the Building Fund that was taken out in May. The projected deficit of \$35,532 was calculated for the second half of the year from this analysis. The Church Board reached out to District Superintendent, Karen Munson. Karen recommended we act on two things. One was to do a viability study which Green Street will take on in August and September. The second was to get in touch with Dr. Pat MacHugh, chair of the Equitable Compensation Committee of the New England Conference to apply for an emergency grant. After sharing our situation, Dr. MacHugh felt Green Street could indeed benefit from an Emergency Grant as we were able to show we would not be able to pay the pastor's salary in the months ahead.
