Pastor's Message

The Dark Night

The Dark Night of Advent

It feels wonderful to sense God's movement in the world, to be on a spiritual journey that takes us deep, to experience fulfillment in our spiritual practices and prayer. And it feels awful to lose that sense of God's presence, to feel like we're going through the motions of spirituality, when our prayers and practices become empty ritual.

In his poem The Dark Night, St. John of the Cross, a 16th century priest, describes this experience not as separation from God, but rather as the difficult journey toward deeper spiritual maturity. This dark night of the soul feels like a growing apart from God, but is ironically the path leading closer to God.

Churches, organizations and communities also go through dark nights. Congregations may experience a time of spiritual upheaval – the steady faith of the past, the certainty of God's presence, and comfortable spiritual practices are stripped away; the congregation finds itself in emptiness and unknowing. As painful as this feels, it is precisely this experience that leads congregations to discover God in new ways and to live more fully centered in God. Sandra Cronk says that in this dark, empty place of loss we "confront the limit of all finite things, including the limit of ourselves." At our own limits, we grow aware of the God who transcends our understanding, the God who exists beyond our human limits.

We celebrate Advent during the darkest time of year. This season, we will explore the dark night of the soul through the Advent and Christmas stories

Simplified Board Highlights

Henry read Psalm 121. We shared a silent prayer for one another and the work of the board. Henry then shared a prayer.

Church's Ministry and Mission section of the Church Profile. The board worked to complete this section is very important as it is used for the purpose of Pastoral Appointments. We understand that our needs may change as we complete the 213 discussions and discernment. The next opportunity for discussion will be **Sunday, December 1 at 1 P.M**.

The church board scheduled a Church Board Retreat for Saturday, January 25th.

Generative Work as a Finance Committee

- The 2019 Current Expense budget was shared with updates and choices to consider for meeting year end demands.
- A **MOTION** was made to recommend church conference approve the removal of the "designated fund" label on the Fifield Tribou fund so that it may be used at the discretion of the church board. This will allow easy access should we need money to meet our budget demands in December or in the new year. This was approved at Church conference.
- We will have a **Year End Appeal** during the month of December with the hope we will receive at least \$5,000. This will be applied to the operating budget.
- The church board wants to encourage everyone to **fill out their pledge cards** for 2020 if they have not already done so. This will help us with planning as we discern a way forward.
- Karen Munson, district superintendent has asked us to prepare a half year budget, January June.

Responding to the 213 Study

- We reviewed information from November 4th and conversations of November 10th
- MOTION to explore becoming a Cooperative Parish with another River Network Church or Churches Some of the reasons to try this are the potential for new energy, we need to try something different, we can create new relationships, we may save money, we would be sharing the unique gifts of many, new model of ministry and opportunity for growth.

Holiday Leftovers Shepard's Pie (A Martha Stewart Recipe)

3 cups stuffing

1 cup cranberry sauce

1 pound sliced turkey

10oz.leftover vegetables

4-6 Tablespoons gravy

3-4 cups mashed potatoes

Preheat oven to 350. Spread stuffing in a 9" pie plate. Layer with cranberry sauce, turkey and vegetables. Drizzle with gravy and spread potatoes over the top. Place pie on baking sheet. Bake 35-40 min until potatoes are golden brown.
