PRINCIPAL'S PAGE



It has been a wonderful week back after the winter recess. The students are engaged in their learning and the staff will continue to ensure that they are successful.

During the next two weeks at Lakeside, students will participate in the following assessments:

- Winter MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) to K 6. The MAP is a computer adapted assessment and is administered in the fall, winter and spring.
- GOI's (Greater Outcome Indicators) to K-4. This assessment is used to monitor growth in foundational literacy skills.

This winter we face a newly complex challenge. A host of respiratory viruses, including influenza, RSV and COVID-19. The NYS Health Department encourages these commonsense precautions to prevent the spread:

- 1. Staying up to date on vaccines, including Flu and COVID-19.
- 2. Washing your hands often with soap and hot water for at least 20 seconds.
- 3. Not coughing or sneezing into your hands; sneeze or cough into your elbow.
- 4. Staying home when sick or symptomatic.
- 5. Wearing a well-fitting, high-quality mask when in public indoor spaces

LAKESIDE LIONS

building 21st century skills in technology

Kindergarteners learned how to navigate their iPads and access our district subscriptions and applications. Students learned strategies for Internet safety and how to say goodbye to technology even when it feels difficult. In our next unit, our youngest coders were introduced to computer science with "unplugged" block-style directions that teach coding basics. Students have begun to apply these pre-coding strategies during their independent work and are excited to practice these skills with robots.

Digital Tools: Clever, Seesaw, Kodable, Puzzlets, Dash robots

First graders reviewed iPad basics at the start of the school year. Students discussed the importance of being safe and smart online before having the opportunity to use the Internet for visiting far away places. They practiced navigating the Internet safely on the San Diego Zoo's Wildlife Explorers website. Students have started their coding unit and are learning to drag and drop a sequenced series of commands to complete coding challenges. First graders are looking forward to learning more coding concepts.

Digital Tools: Clever, Seesaw, Nearpod, Kodable, Puzzlets, Dash robots

Second graders were introduced to their classroom laptops, network accounts, and Office 365 apps. Students learned and discussed digital citizenship concepts such as navigating the Internet safely and the importance of having device-free times. Our young programmers are building on their pre-coding skills. They are using block-coding to create algorithms, repeat code with loops, and debug errors. Second graders are getting ready to practice these coding concepts with robots.

Digital Tools: Clever, Seesaw, Word, PowerPoint, Code.org

Fifth graders studied digital citizenship concepts through class discussions and interactive lessons. Students learned about the importance of balancing media use with periods of time off of technology. They also learned about cyberbullying and ways to be an upstander. Fifth graders created mini-posters in PowerPoint to teach their peers these strategies. As part of our coding unit, the students are using Code.org to learn about events, loops, and conditionals. These help us to create more interactive games.

Digital Tools: Clever, Nearpod, PowerPoint, Code.org

Sixth graders learned that being a good digital citizen is a lifelong skill. They participated in many conversations, discussions, and debates about online safety and media balance concepts such as taking breaks from technology to maintain a healthy mindset, keeping personal information private, and staying true to yourself online. In coding, sixth grade students are practicing using events, conditionals, and functions on Code.org. These computer science concepts help us to create more advanced code.

LAKESIDE LIONS

building 21st century skills in library

Kindergarten: Since their first visit in September, the kindergarten students have learned so much in the library. They learned about caring for our amazing books as well as the responsibility of checking out books. We have shared many books, always discussing the roles of the author and illustrator, and most recently, our youngest students learned the words to sing our favorite song to help them decide if a book is fiction or nonfiction.

Read Alouds Included: Giraffes Can't Dance and Giraffes: The World's Tallest Mammal, Spookly, the Square Pumpkin and Pumpkins, Every Little Letter, Read It, Don't Eat It, Run Turkey Run and Turkey Trouble.

First grade: Our first graders have enjoyed returning to the library to check out great books and discover new ways to navigate their space. We have explored call numbers and spine labels, while always reviewing the different sections of the library and ways to locate what we are looking for. Through our selected readalouds, we have discussed characters and setting, along with fiction and nonfiction differences. We are always teaching skills and life lessons through the fabulous stories shared with our students.

Read Alouds Included: The Best Book to Read, Bad Apple, Big Pumpkin, Bats at the Library, T'was the Night Before Thanksgiving, as well as our school-wide book, Every Little Letter.

Second grade: The second graders loved coming back to library this year, learning about the many new opportunities they will have throughout the year. They have been focusing on the different types of nonfiction genres, learning about literary nonfiction and how we approach reading it differently than a traditional nonfiction book. We have also practiced using call numbers to locate books and examined how nonfiction and fiction call numbers share different information.

Read Alouds Included: Born to Read, Z is for Moose, How Many Seeds in a Pumpkin, A Very Witchy Spelling

Bee and Thank You, Sarah. Our second graders also loved learning the valuable messages in Every Little

Letter.

Third grade: Students come to the library each cycle for their library/tech lesson in which we integrate library skills along with our technology curriculum. We began by reviewing the entire layout of the library with access to all books available for third graders. We shared the importance of finding the joy in reading with, I Hate Picture Books and enjoyed life lessons in Every Little Letter. Students have been immersed in digital citizenship using Nearpod, an interactive learning experience, supported with books such as Our Table and TEK, furthering the concepts of taking time off our devices and finding a healthy balance. This unit has also included impactful lessons on strong passwords and internet safety.

Fourth grade: Library has been a fabulous opportunity for our avid readers in fourth grade to visit each week, building their library and media skills, while concentrating on different aspects of library and technology. We reviewed the functional use of the library, including call numbers and independent searching skills. Fourth graders were then immersed in a unit on digital citizenship, using Nearpod's interactive lessons. We shared important messages about social media with Nerdy Birdy and other books. Some of our powerful messages came from the books A Walk in the Words and Every Little Letter. We celebrated our successes with a digital breakout room, working cooperatively to solve problems online.
