We would like to share grade level updates from Levy Lakeside School.

Kindergarten

Lakeside kindergartners have been very busy. We are boosting our reading powers and becoming avid readers. In writing, we enjoy writing how-to books, and showing off what we know. Many of us are learning how to ride two-wheelers as the weather outside gets warmer! We are learning about living and non-living things in science and had fun in our previous unit about "push and pull." It's all "adding up" in math, as we continue to work hard. Lakeside has many "first-graders in training!"

Grade One

First grade was so excited to share their nonfiction, How-To Books and restaurant reviews with their families and friends at a spring writing celebration. They are learning all about money and have been exploring a coin unit using real coins and were even able to participate in a pretend toy store! We are looking forward to our May field trip to Long Island Children's Museum to see a live performance of Elephant and Piggie.

Grade Two

Second graders have been soaring right into spring! We have started an exciting new program in our STEAM Lab combining technology and creativity. Throughout the eight-week cycle, second grade students will learn all about the features of stop motion animation! Be sure to ask your child all about it! LIGHTS-CAMERA-ACTION! May marks the beginning of the infamous second grade play! Throughout the months of May and June, students will have the opportunity to participate in several play practices coordinated by an outside company to build on their facial expressions, body movements, and ability to work together as a team to make a story come to life. We look forward to seeing all parents on June 7th to watch your little actor and actress shine!





Grade Three

Third-grade students have been learning various reading strategies on how to tackle challenging fiction and nonfiction texts, as well as writing short responses that include several details from the text. They also have been busy learning about the cultures of China and Brazil. The entire grade will be going to the Vanderbilt Planetarium and Museum in May, where they will be learning about sea life and the night sky. This will help the students when they start their animal research groups.

Grade Four

Fourth grade has been having fun and working hard learning about the settling and founding of New York. We are also busy exploring geometry and using protractors. Our Fourth graders are looking forward to reading historical fiction, researching the American revolution, and an upcoming interactive colonial experience!

Grade Five

The fifth graders really enjoyed learning how to play chess with the "Chessnuts." Many students were also able to advance their skills. Timelines are on view in the fifth grade hallway. These Timelines connect to social studies in that they illustrate personal turning points and world-wide turning points. We have also begun making 3-d key chains in our technology class. The fifth graders are also looking forward to upcoming field trips!

Grade Six

Sixth grade is looking forward to a culmination of their Lakeside Career. We have a busy spring. In May we will be visiting with our 7th grade buddies at MAMS and learning about history at the Holocaust Memorial and Tolerance Center in Glen Cove. We will be getting ready for our big day on June 16th and ready to party on June 5th with our sixth grade friends. We are looking forward to making our final memories here at Lakeside Class of 2023.

building 21st century skills in technology

Kindergarteners enjoyed learning about coding. They are now using their coding skills to tell digital stories in a program called ScratchJr. They are learning to create characters, settings and programs to tell their digital stories.

Digital Tools: Clever, ScratchJr

First graders have grown so much as programmers! First graders are using ScratchJr to create and tell digital stories across multiple pages. They design characters, settings and include dialogue to create more interesting stories.

Second graders are extremely excited about the new program they're learning about called Bloxels. They are creating video games that include characters, settings, hazards and collectibles of their choosing to tell their story and create a fun video game for users.

Fifth graders loved learning about coding and drones. The unit culminated with students developing a flight plan to solve a real-world simulation. Now, they are learning about 3D design and printing using a website called TinkerCAD.

Digital Tools: Drone Blocks, TinkerCAD

Sixth graders finished their coding unit by making real-world connections to drones. Collaborating with their peers, they created missions by selecting real-world scenarios and coding flight plans. They are currently enhancing their 3D design skills through TinkerCAD.

building 21st century skills in library

Kindergarten students come to library each week and have become more proficient at finding and selecting new books. They are also beginning to integrate technology into our library lessons. Kindergarteners are using apps on their iPads including Seesaw and ChatterPix to respond to our books. We share our successes in the Seesaw journal, and have embarked on animation, bringing characters to life in ChatterPix.

Read Alouds Included: Happy Valentine's Day Mouse, 100 Day Worries, Hop on Pop, Mae Among the Stars, and The Book Hog.

First graders have expanded upon their library navigation skills and make appropriate choices for their personal interests. We have integrated technology into our literary responses through the Seesaw platform, where students have expanded their digital response skills. Students also enjoy using ChatterPix to bring characters alive and are currently working on creative projects where we animate our book characters.

Read Alouds Included: Love Splat, Love Monster, Green Eggs and Ham, Margaret and the Moon, Where is Bina Bear, and The Day the Crayons Quit.

Second graders have been excited about the new opportunity to select chapter books in a series from the back of the library. They have learned strategies to ensure they choose "justright" books. They are also recommending different series to their peers and enjoying reading their favorite series. Second graders use Seesaw as a digital communication tool to respond to our lessons and share their posts responsibly with their classmates.

Read Alouds Included: Petunia, Amelia Bedelia's First Valentine, Trombone Shorty, The Watcher, There's a Wocket in My Pocket and Living Sunlight.

Third graders are immersed in our coding unit, learning the skills necessary to apply to most coding languages. They are learning about debugging our code along with creating events and using loops to repeat actions. Third graders use our coding lessons to enhance and build upon their knowledge, learning and practicing during each library session.

Read Alouds Included: Girl Running, Counting on Katherine, and What Pet Should I Get.

Fourth graders enjoy coding and understanding how events create actions in our programs. They are learning how to be efficient by adding loops as well as nested loops to shorten our lines of code. Students are also learning about conditionals through if and if/else statements within our algorithms to help the program make decisions.

Read Alouds Included: Girl Running, Counting on Katherine, What Pet Should I Get, and Testing the Ice
