





During our first trimester in computers and technology, the students discussed the importance of Digital Citizenship, specifically staying safe and smart while spending time online. Ten Elements of Dignity


Acceptance of Identity

BUS BEHAVIOR AND SAFETY

On November 1, our students participated in a bus drill. The goal is to encourage positive behavior on the school bus, ensuring that all children's experiences are enjoyable and comfortable. We encourage you to review and discuss our Lakeside Community Bus Rules included below. We look forward to continuing to meet throughout the year to engage in community building activities, work together to problem-solve specific issues, and generate ideas for responsible group behavior.

Stay seated at all times; the driver or a teacher may tell you where to sit.

Always respect others, the bus, and yourself. Be a Bucketfiller and ROARS student.

Flinging things in or out of the bus is not allowed.

Eating and drinking on the bus are not allowed.

Talk quietly; no hurtful words.

You are responsible for your actions.

LOST AND FOUND: When you are in the building, please stop by our lost and found to see if your child misplaced a clothing item or lunchbox/water bottle. If you have not already done this, please label all student jackets, lunch boxes and water bottles with your child's name. This way we can return the item to your child.

MORNING ARRIVAL: If you use the front circle during morning drop-off, please keep the following in mind to help keep the flow of traffic moving:

- Have students ready to exit the vehicle once you are in the loop (i.e. have materials in hand such as bookbags, water bottles, etc.).
- Have students exit the vehicle to the curbside.
- Parents/guardians should always remain in the vehicles.
- Please refer to Jason, our security agent, for instructions. We try to move vehicles up as far as possible so we can get as many cars/buses into the loop at once. This will help speed up the process for everyone.

Below are updates from the Lakeside staff:

Pre-K	This month pre-k learners have been exploring our math curriculum including counting, number recognition and adding. We are starting Second Step for social-emotional learning. We are so excited to be doing an apple experiment in the last week of October! We will be completing many crafts to take home and learning about letters D, E, F, and G. We have been enjoying the beautiful weather and are looking forward to Halloween Fun!
Kindergarten	The learners at Lakeside are "falling" in love with Kindergarten. We have quickly settled into a routine and are striving to be "Bucketfillers" every day. We are working on "show and tell" in our writing, shared reading and beginning addition and subtraction. We had so much fun at the Boosterthon, and are looking forward to more fun on Halloween!
1 st Grade	First Graders have been awesome word detectives during reading workshop and received their official badge! They began opinion writing and were super excited to be writing about their collections, we are learning all about shells, cars, rings, rocks and so much more. In math, they are practicing the double facts. The word of the month was recognition, and we discussed how we can honor someone's dignity by recognizing and celebrating their special qualities. We are looking forward to the Halloween parade and our Fall trip to the Long Island Children's Museum!
2 nd Grade	Second Grade is having a wonderful October wrapping up our first reading and writing units. Writers have published their first small moment stories after learning how good writers revise with details like talk and action. On Wednesday, October 23 rd students had an autumnal adventure at Old Bethpage Village Restoration learning about how colonial long islanders lived life long ago. Students are looking forward to STEM centers on Halloween!
3 rd Grade	Third graders are becoming marvelous multipliers are we have begun to learn all our multiplication facts! We are using many different strategies to help us multiply. We are wrapping up our writing unit by revising our all-about books and making our writing sound sophisticated. We are recognizing our friends and family for what makes them special and unique. We cannot wait to start our weather unit in science.

4 th Grade	Fourth Grade is in full swing! We are taking our multiplication facts to the		
	next step by using them to solve larger, multi-digit problems. The whole grade		
	has been digging into character traits and changes while reading The Tiger		
	Rising. This month, students began learning about Earth Science. We		
	examined how rainfall affects living things in different regions. Soon we'll be		
	getting back into Social Studies where we will be learning how different		
	Native American groups lived in what is now New York State.		
5 th Grade	The fifth graders continue to work hard throughout the day. Narrative writing is		
	the current writing unit, and the students are learning to write about things		
	that truly matter to them. They just completed their first science unit of the		
	year, which focused on matter. Students spent their time reading articles and		
	infographics, participating in hands-on experiments, and answering questions to		
	help them to better understand this topic. In math, students have started to		
	learn all about decimals and are doing an amazing job figuring out how to add		
	and subtract them (while not forgetting to line up their decimal points)!		
6 th Grade	The sixth grade had an incredible experience at the Cold Spring Harbor Dolan		
	DNA lab. The students got a chance to extract DNA from wheat germ, learn the		
	true story of Anastasia Romanov, and explore in their interactive		
	museum. They were amazed by the replica of Otzi the Iceman. Only three		
	were made in the world. Each student went home with a souvenir of a DNA		
	necklace. It was an incredible day spent learning, exploring and bonding.		

FLES

In Señora Casey's Spanish classes, Third Graders have been learning greetings, weather, emotions, and numbers in Spanish! They are also participating in a Mariposa (butterfly) Migration Project, and their butterfly designs are on their way across the country!

In Señora Casey's Spanish classes, Fourth Graders have been continuing their learning of Central America and the weather and seasons they experience!

Computers	National Digital Citizenship week was October 14-18. The students have all been learning about the importance of being safe, responsible, and respectful while online.	
Phys Ed	During the month of October in Mr. Corrao and Mr. Wingler's Grades K-2 classes, the students participated in movement activities and Halloween games. Grades 3-6 have been learning skills associated with the sport of Football. As we move into November, we will focus more on fitness and Large Group Games.	
	During the Month of October Mrs. LaCommare's 3-6 students have been finishing up their soccer unit. In Grades K-2 students have been working on building vocabulary skills utilizing the words on the wall and focusing on ball skills. All grades have been participating in Halloween activities. In the coming months, students will be focusing on fitness skills and cooperative large group games.	
Music	Music students at Levy Lakeside School are learning to read rhythm. Students are performing rhythms on unpitched and pitched percussion instruments. Lakeside musicians are singing and showing hand symbols for the notes of the major scale. Lakeside musicians are always asked to participate as respectful audience members. Students are overwhelmingly achieving their goals as audience members simply by treating others the way that they would like to be treated.	
Art	Lakeside's artists are being inspired by nature, literature, artists and their imagination!	
	Primary students are exploring various watercolor resist techniques inspired by fall leaves, textures, feelings and picture books!
