The 25% Rule

A good rule of thumb is to calculate your current storage needs and then add approximately 25% more space for future purchases, seasonal storage, and changing needs.

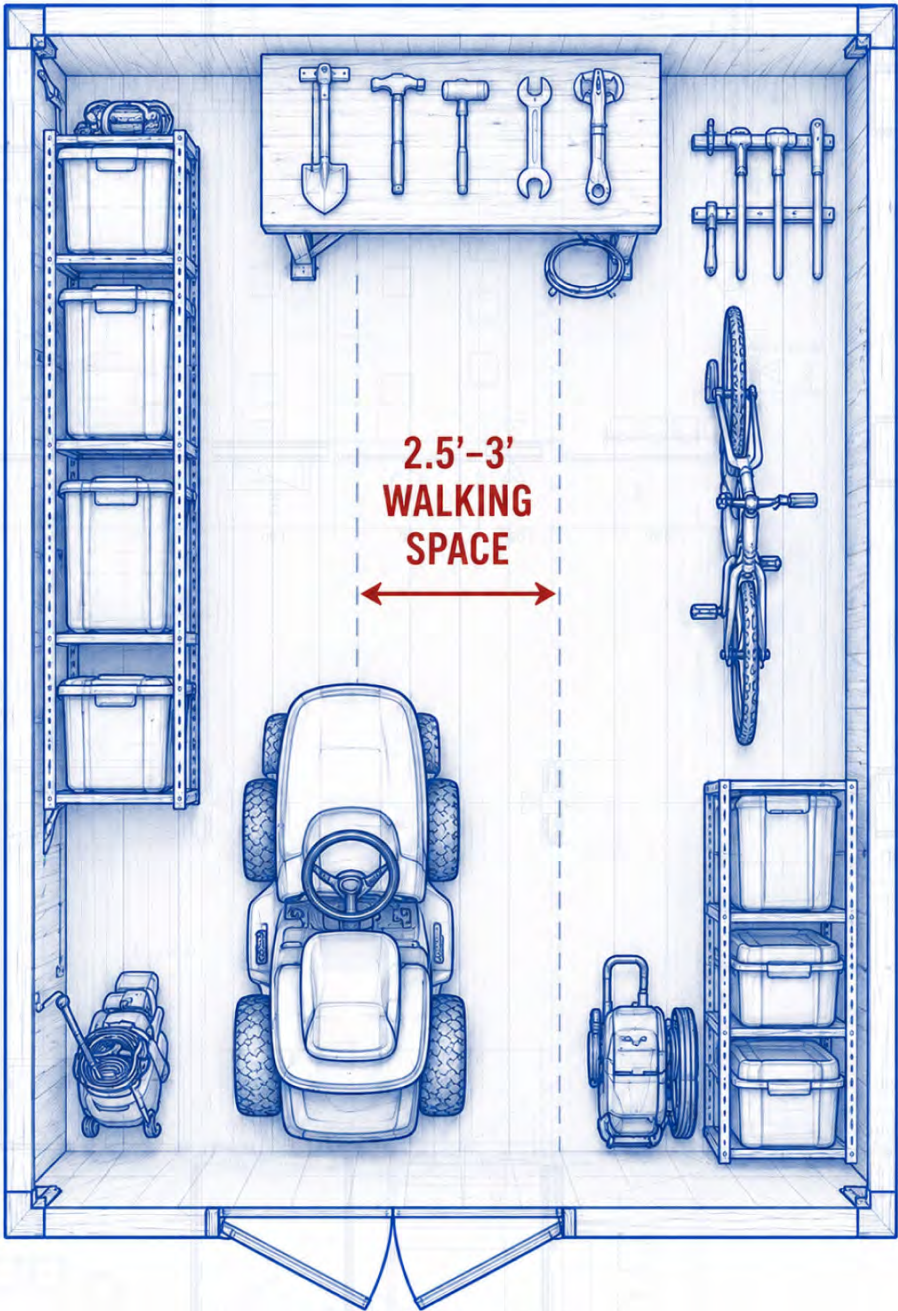
3 Will you use it as storage, workspace, or both?

If you plan to use your shed as both storage and workspace, consider dedicating separate areas for each. This makes the space easier to organize and more enjoyable to use.

4 Do you have an HOA or community restriction on the size allowed on your property?

Before choosing a shed size, check for any HOA or community restrictions that may affect the size, placement, or appearance of your building.





LIBERTY TIP

Remember to include walking space

Many people forget aisle space.

The Me-Space Margin: Liberty Sheds recommends leaving a minimum of 2.5 to 3 feet of open walking lane down the length of the shed. If equipment is packed wall-to-wall, the items in the back become inaccessible.

Common Equipment Sizes

Every storage situation is unique, and we always recommend measuring your largest items before purchasing a shed. Dimensions shown are typical averages – always measure your specific equipment before finalizing your shed size.

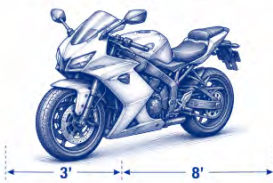

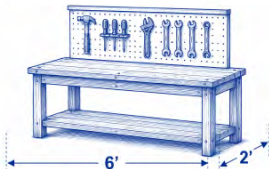

Measure First, Plan Second

Manufacturer dimensions can vary significantly. Before choosing a shed size, measure your largest items and make note of any accessories, attachments, or equipment that may require additional space.

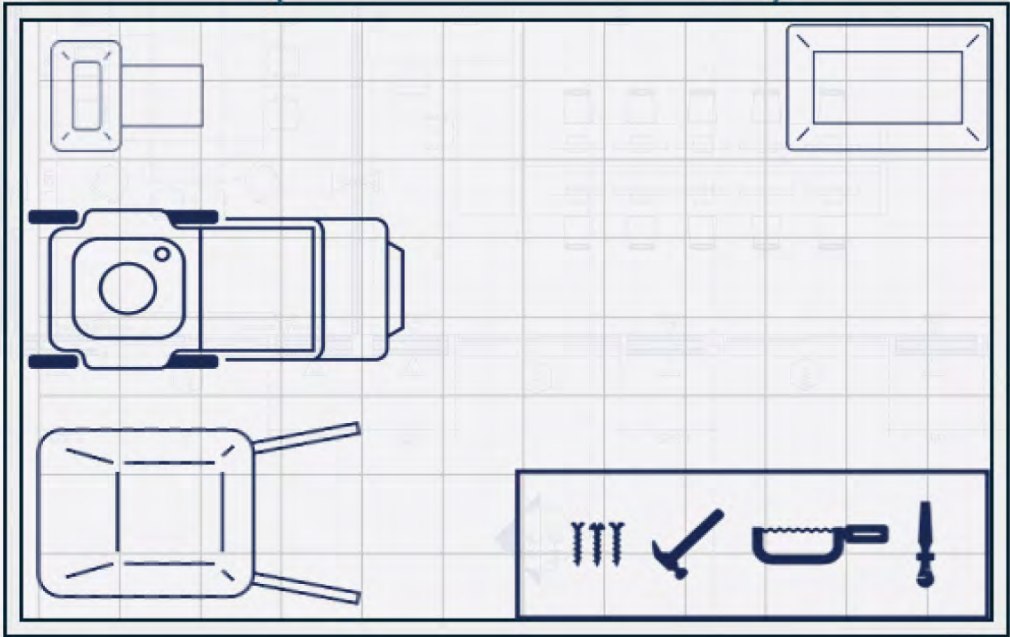
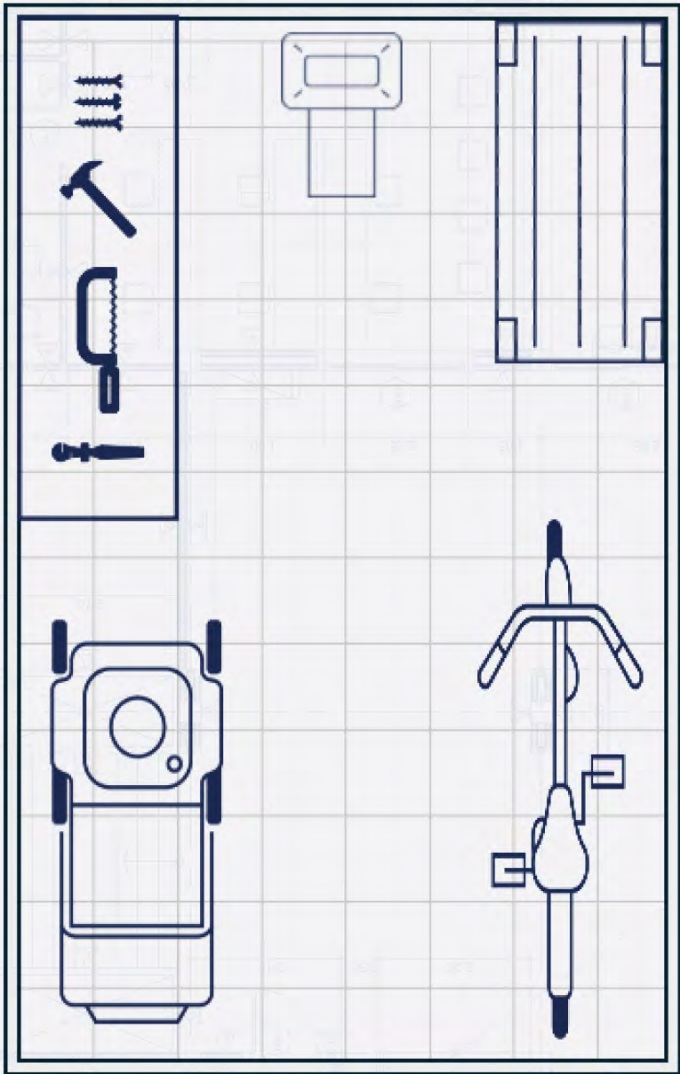
Go Vertical

When space is limited, don't just think about floor space—think about wall space and overhead storage, too.

Taller sidewalls, lofted barns, and overhead loft storage can dramatically increase usable storage without increasing the footprint of your shed. Seasonal decorations, camping gear, and other infrequently used items are perfect candidates for off-the-floor storage.

If local regulations or yard space limit the size of your shed, going vertical may be the smartest way to gain additional storage capacity.

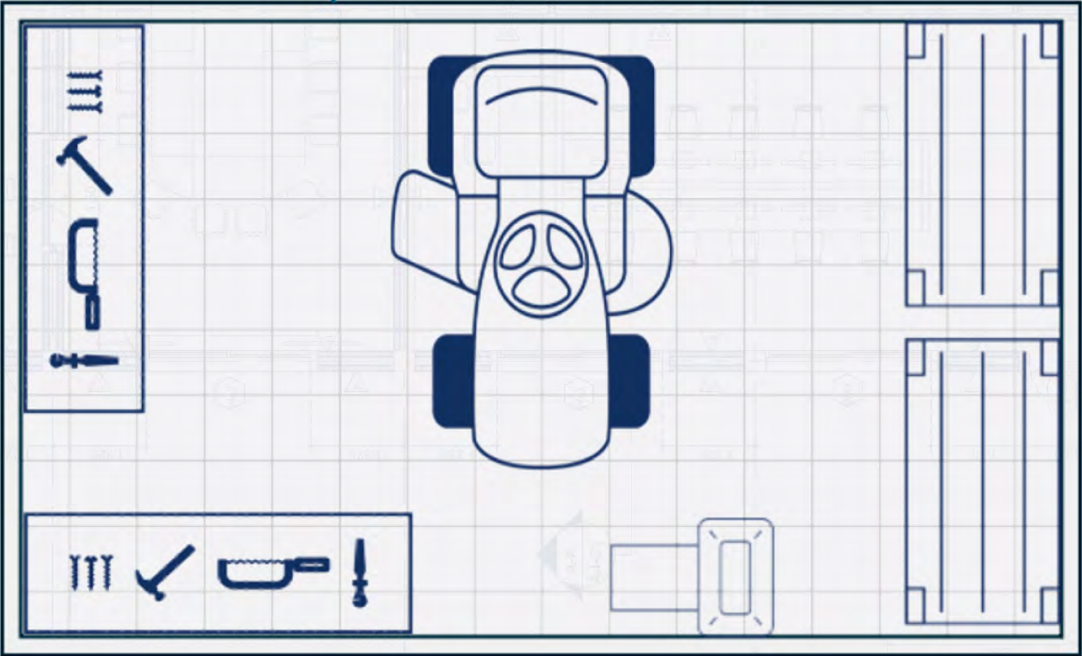
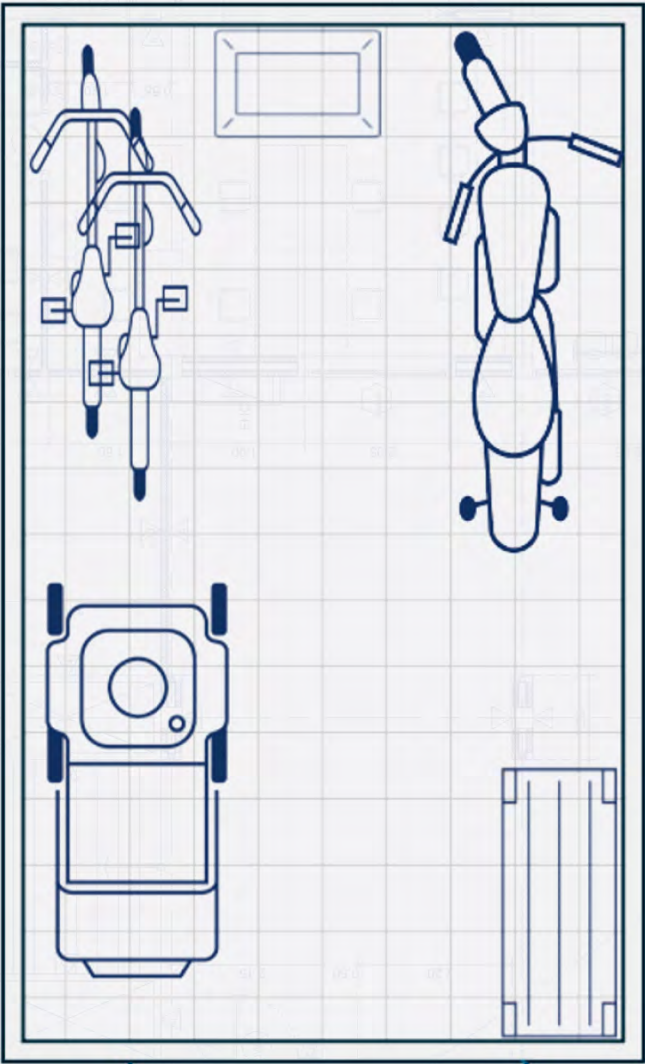


Make the Most of Every Inch



Many homeowners overlook valuable wall space. Rakes, shovels, extension cords, and other long-handled tools can often be stored between wall studs or mounted on wall storage systems, keeping the floor clear and improving access to larger items.

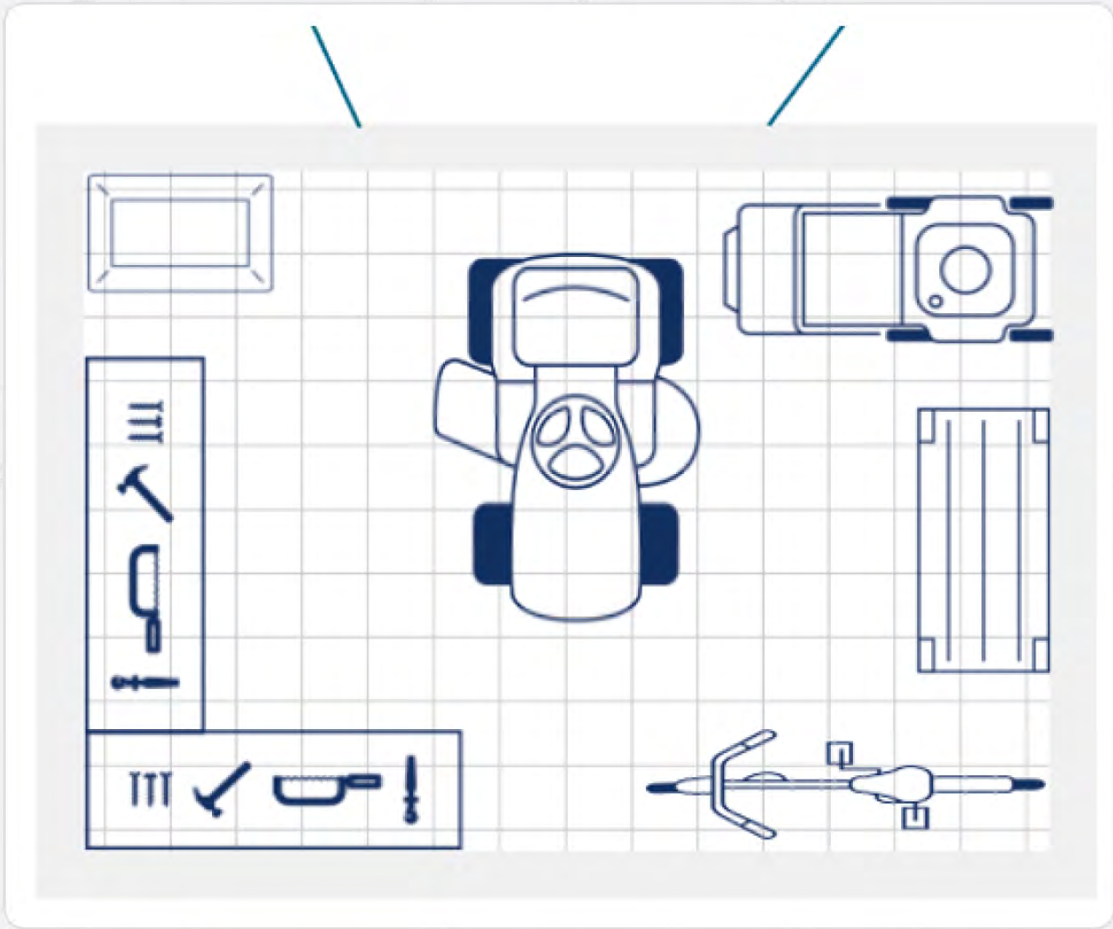
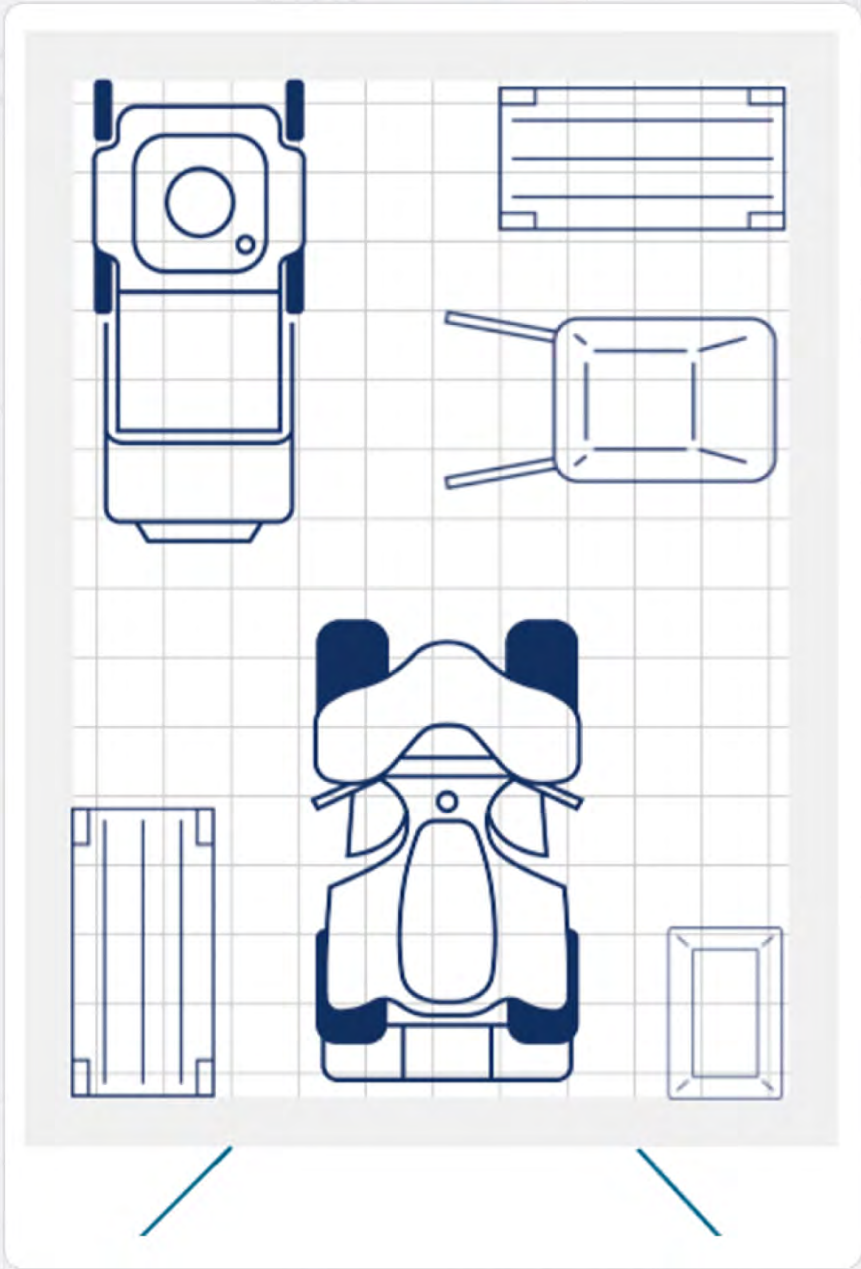


Plan Around Your Largest Item

Before organizing a shed, identify the item that will require the most floor space—whether that's a riding mower, golf cart, ATV, or workbench.

Position larger items first, then build your storage plan around them. This approach helps maintain clear walkways and makes the most efficient use of available space.

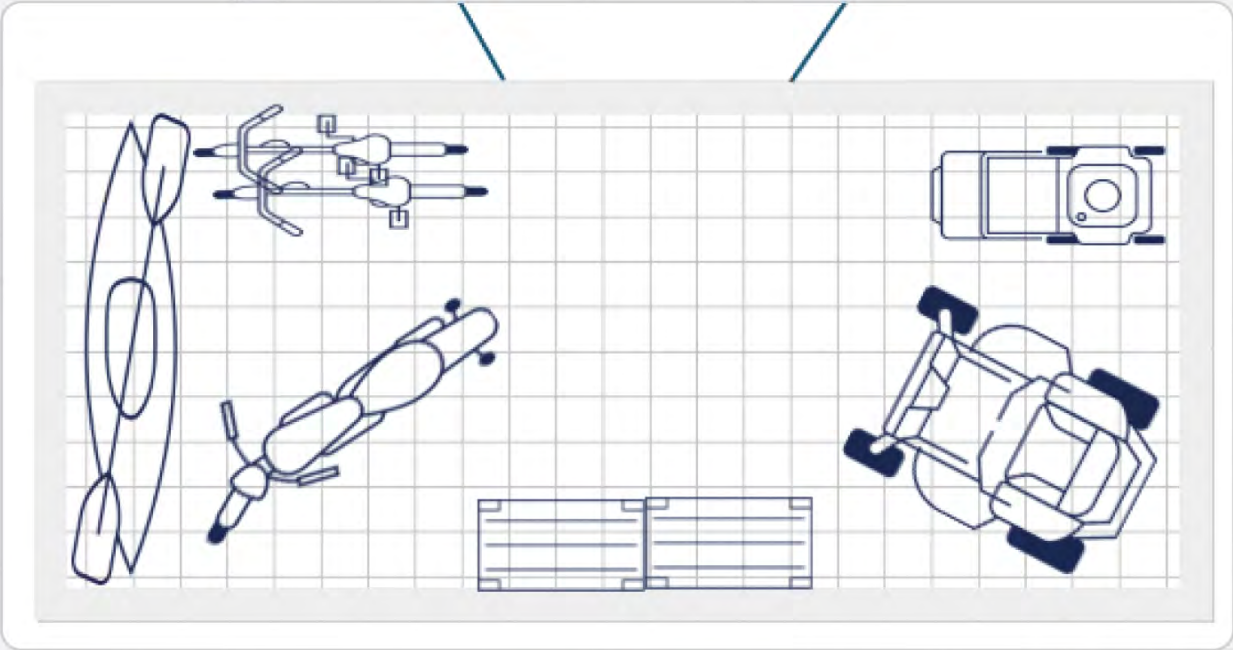
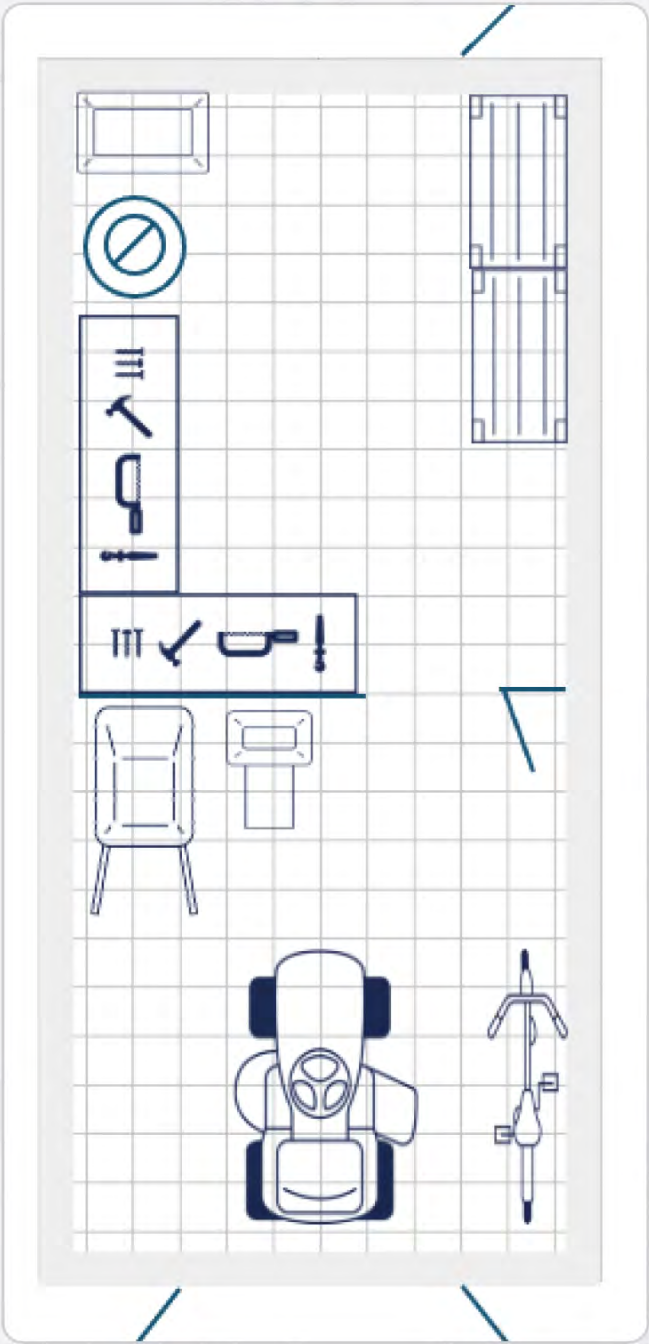
Create Dedicated Zones

One of the biggest advantages of a larger shed is the ability to create separate storage zones.

Consider dedicating one area to lawn and garden equipment, another to seasonal storage, and a third to a workshop or hobby space. Dividing your shed into functional zones helps keep everything organized and easier to access year-round.

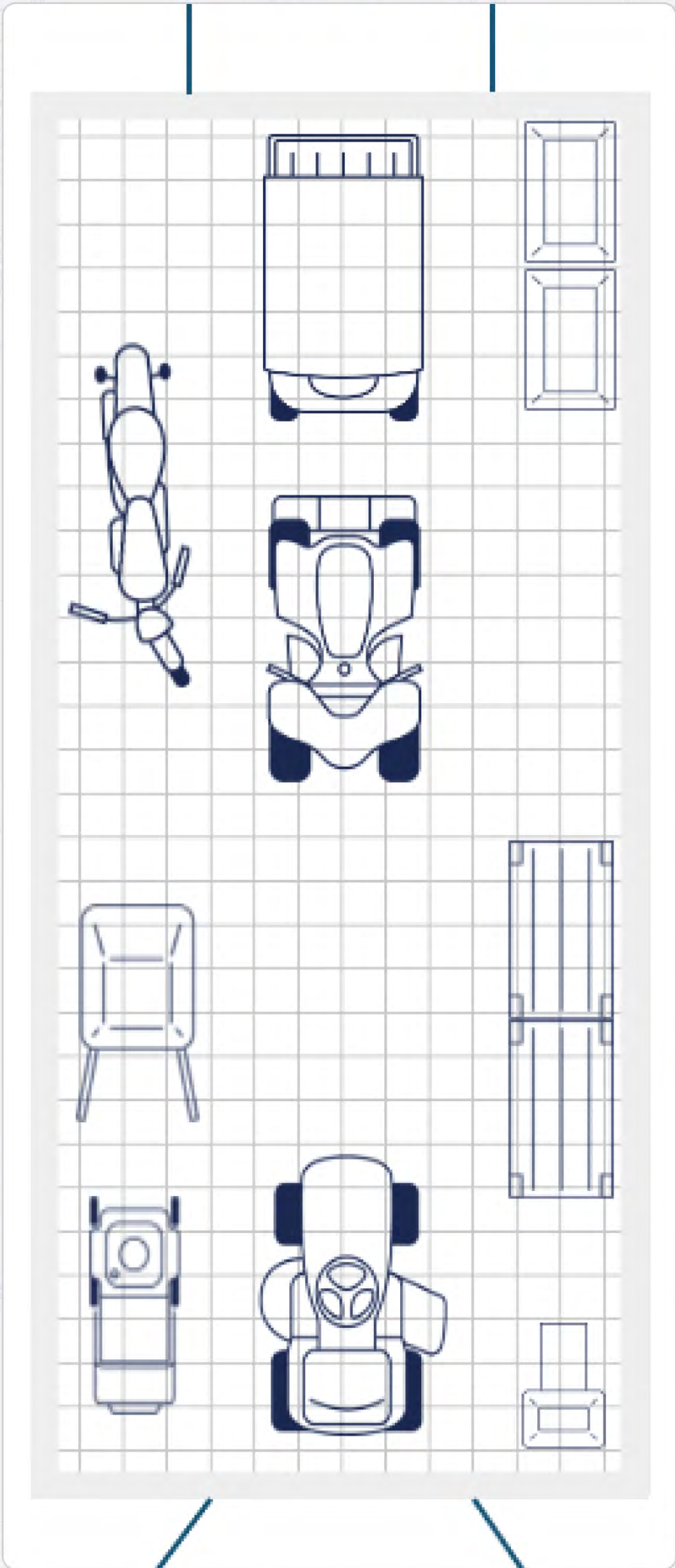


Think Beyond Floor Space

Before selecting a shed, measure both the footprint and the height of your largest items. Equipment such as golf carts, side-by-sides, utility trailers, and taller equipment may require additional door clearance or increased wall height.

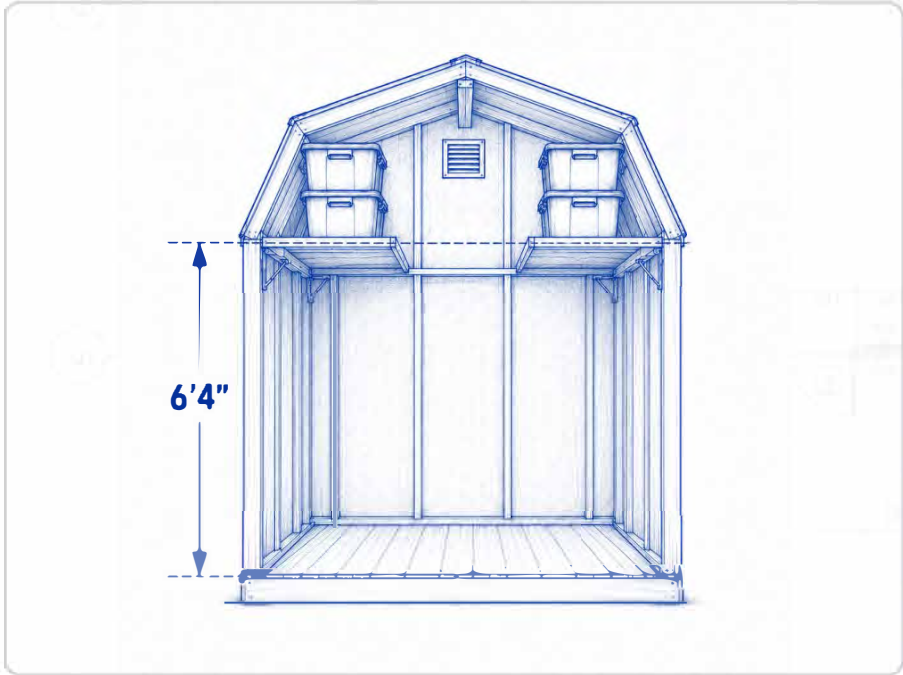
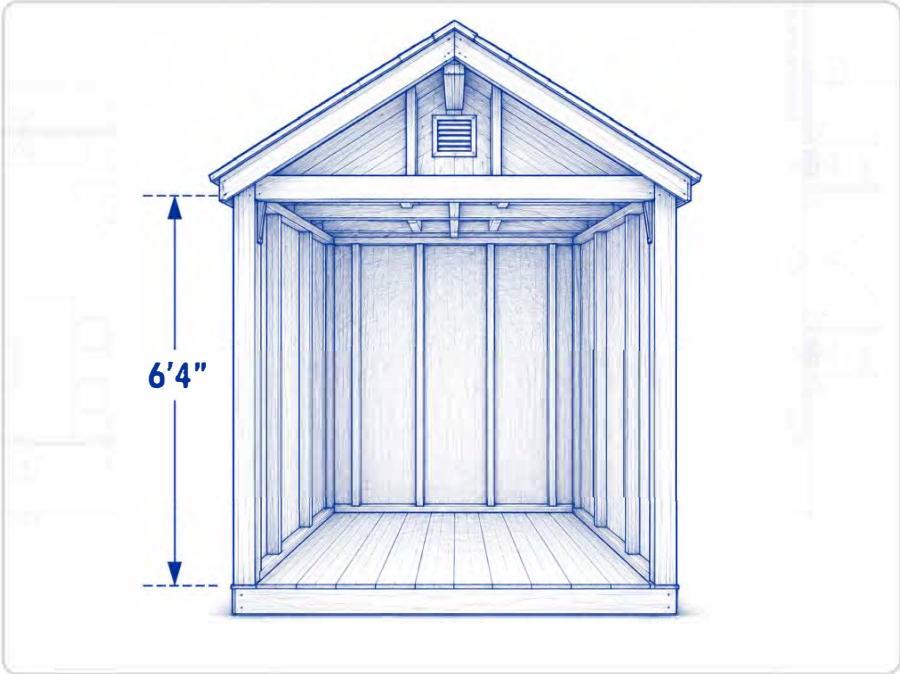
Shed Shape & Height Makes a Difference

Lofted Barn

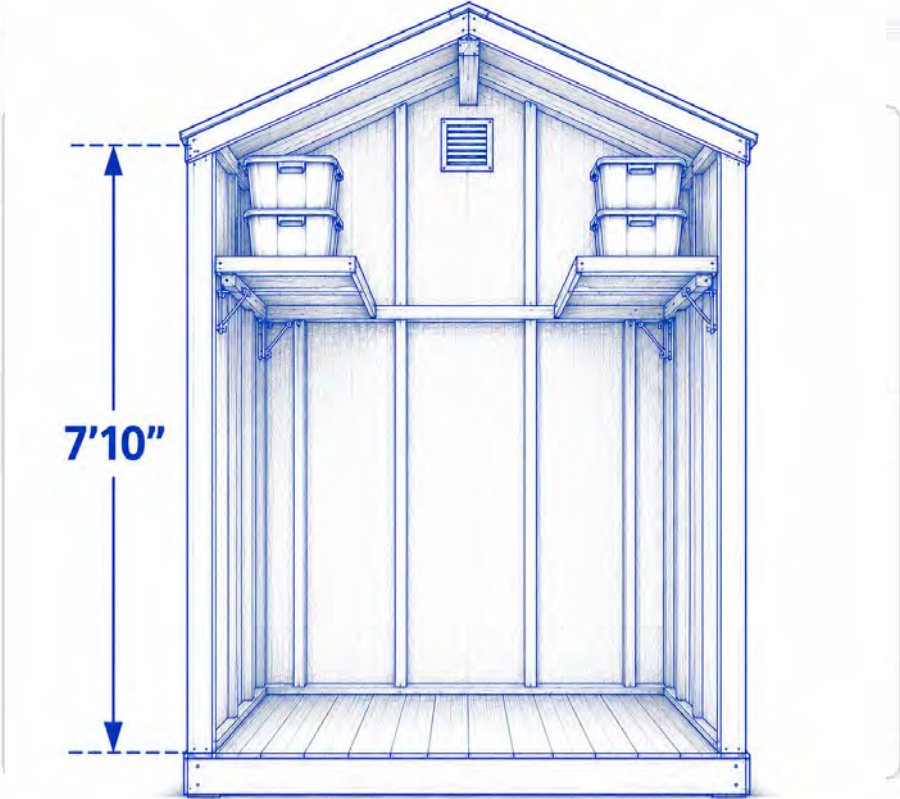

7'4" OR HIGHER WALL HEIGHT

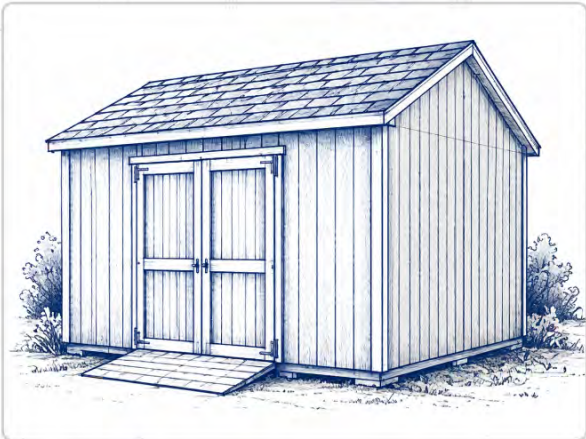

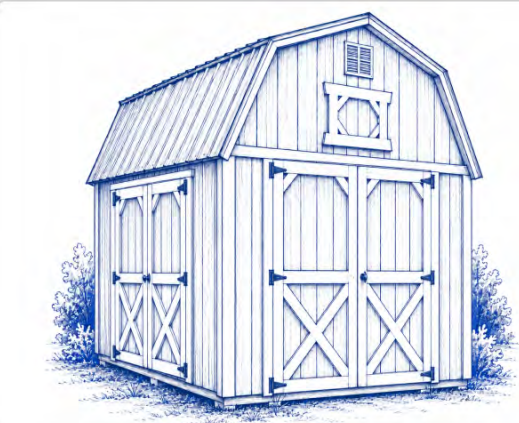
Choosing the Right Door Matters

Getting items **INTO** your shed can be just as important as fitting them inside.

Double Doors



Liberty's standard 6' double doors provide generous access for riding mowers and everyday equipment. Because standard door sizes vary by manufacturer, it's important to compare door openings—not just shed dimensions.



Additional Doors

One of the biggest advantages of a custom-built shed is the ability to place doors exactly where you need them. Additional doors improve accessibility, reduce unnecessary trips through the building, and make larger sheds more convenient to use every day.



Garage Doors

Garage doors offer the greatest combination of width and height, making them ideal for golf carts, utility vehicles, and other taller equipment.

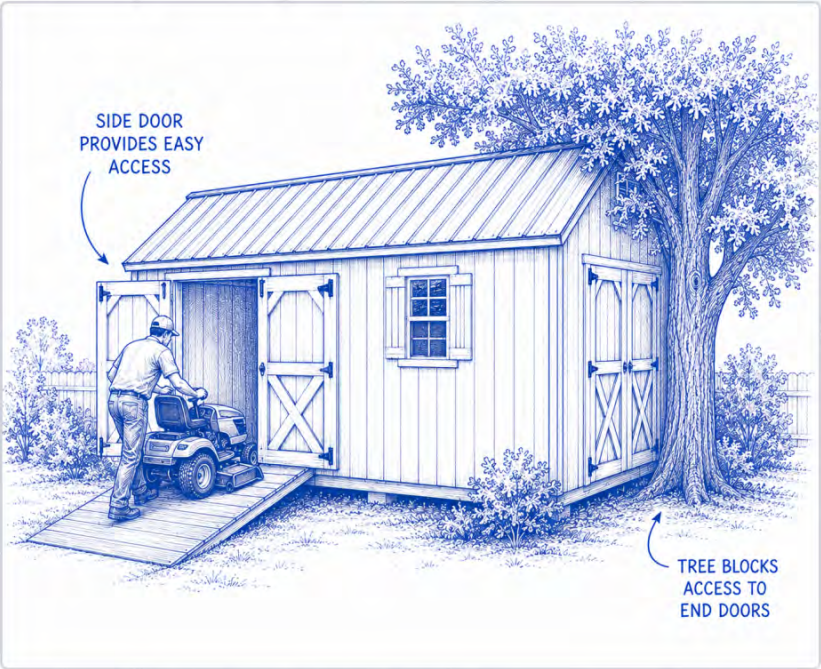


LIBERTY TIP

Door placement should be a key consideration when determining where your shed will be located on your property.

Think about how equipment will enter and exit the building, the available clearance around the shed, and whether your largest items will benefit from the additional height often available at end-wall door locations.
