A Home For Those Who Have None

The Opportunity

We have identified a rare and immediate opportunity to secure a purpose-built home in Jerusalem for religious female lone soldiers serving in the IDF.

A 1,000 sqm property.

A home for up to 70 soldiers.

A transformational national project.

This is not simply accommodation. This is stability, dignity, and future-building for those who defend Israel without family support.

The Problem

Today, hundreds of religious female soldiers:

- **Serve in frontline combat roles**
- **Return from base to no home or support system**
- **Are placed in unsuitable, non-religious or unstable housing**

While the majority are English-speaking lone soldiers from abroad, approximately 15–20 residents will be Israeli-born lone soldiers from deeply challenging backgrounds.

Many come from Broken homes, Trauma backgrounds, Complete absence of parental support. There is currently no dedicated solution for them.


The Solution

We are creating a permanent, high-quality residence in Jerusalem
Designed specifically for religious female lone soldiers, This will provide:

- A home-from-home environment
- Emotional, spiritual and practical support
- A safe, religiously aligned community
- A pathway into post-army life, education and careers

What This Really Is

This is not just a building.
It is a lifeline, a national responsibility, and a replicable model for Israel.

Why Now?

Because this is a critical gap that can no longer be ignored.

A significant number of religious female combat lone soldiers are serving Israel at all levels, yet return from their bases to instability, isolation, and, in many cases, no real home or support structure.

This project directly addresses that unmet need by creating a permanent, high-quality residence that provides not just accommodation, but security, dignity, and a foundation for long-term success. It is an opportunity to deliver immediate, tangible impact, transforming the lives of these young women while establishing a scalable, national model of care that will support generations of soldiers to come.

We strongly believe that supporting these soldiers now will enable them to prosper and build strong homes in Israel in the future.

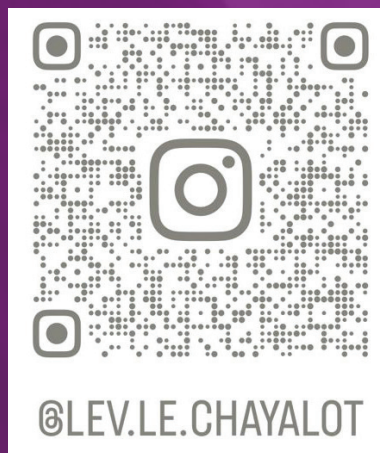
