
From President Kay Roach





Mission u 2018: Experiencing Transforming Grace

"...but grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ..." II Peter 3:18

Did you join with 283 other United Methodist Women and yes, some men, too, and attend Mission u 2018 at Bethune-Cookman University in July? What an awesome experience! Was it life-changing for you? I know it was for me back in 2010 when I attended my first Mission u (or School of Christian Mission, as it was called back then). And every year it's been better and better.

Mission u is a wonderful way to rekindle or deepen one's faith. It is a Christian educational program grounded in social action and spirituality—Wesley's acts of mercy and acts of piety. For the past six years the focus of Mission u has been on TRANSFORMATION. And 2018 was no different—II Peter 3:18 says it all: Mission u is where we grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ—where we can experience Jesus Christ's TRANSFORMING GRACE.

The Mission u Committee tried something different – some things new and some things "tried and tue" – this year that was based on attendees' comments and evaluations from prior years: we offered one mission study instead of two. We wanted to provide more time for study and relaxation, spiritual formation, fellowship, and social action. We had a new "First Timers" gathering, a re-vised update session for District Officers, a Focus on Action session, and the "Mission Sampler": an event brought from past years where attendees had the opportunity to experience an overview of all three mission studies.

As 2018 Dean Paulette Monroe wrote in her Mission u program introduction: by providing more opportunities to experience transformative learning, attendees would be so challenged that they would take this learning beyond their comfort zone into their local churches and communities. The one class, reminiscent of early SCM years, and based on the feedback we received, it was what you wanted—and needed. It was well received as comments of attendees provided – it was "applauded". We will continue the one-class format next year.

As the new dean for 2019, I welcome your comments and suggestions for improving our Florida Conference United Methodist Women Mission u – and look forward to seeing you next year.

Seeking Health and Wholeness: An Earth Perspective for Covenantal Living



This year's study, part two of the 2017 study, was geared toward God's design for our lives in the present times. The study's primary focus was centered in a theology of wholeness in which God is creator of everything, is in all of His creation and covenants His disciples to a faith of mutuality in caring for the earth and its inhabitants. Creation, community and self are to be faithfully reverenced as sacred. Preventing pollution in its various forms; caring for oneself through individual and corporate worship; making Sabbath for self; and making it all work in practical ways in local, national and international communities; all honor the Creator.

The women put together a quilt in which in their own word, design, or scripture demonstrated their faith in ecology and movement toward planetary wholeness. They used colored markers on squares of cloth to visually portray faith and action on the road to 'ecological resurrection.' The finished product was

not only beautiful, but also demonstrated our oneness in Christ as we work individually and corporately to be in covenant with our Creator.

Mission u offers opportunities of learning and spiritual growth for adults, young adults, youth, and children. As in prior years, classes will be offered in English, Creole, Spanish, and Korean.

The new mission studies for 2019 are:

<u>Spiritual Growth Study</u>: Practicing Resurrection: The Gospel of Mark and Radical Discipleship In *Mark and Radical Discipleship*, author Janet Wolf explores what it means to live a life of radical discipleship today using the Gospel of Mark as the foundation. Wolf explores the timeless issues of poverty, gender, justice, liberation, equality, and others using Mark as a guide.

MARKED: A Mission Journey with Jesus in the Gospel of Mark: A Children's Study In *MARKED: A Mission Journey with Jesus in the Gospel of Mark*, author Rita Hays invites children to join Jesus on an exciting lifelong pilgrimage of discipleship and mission.

Who do you say that I am? Meeting Jesus through the Eyes of Mark (Final Title TBD) A Youth Study

In Who do you say that I am? Meeting Jesus through the Eyes of Mark, author Carolyn Poling guides youth through the Gospel of Mark, helping them to define who Jesus is to them, who he says he is in scripture, and how this impacts how we live our lives..

<u>Geographic Study</u>: United For Change: United Methodist Women in Mission: 150 Years and Beyond (Final Title TBD)

United for Change by Ellen Blue is the first in a two-year study commemorating United Methodist Women's 150th anniversary in 2019. It will provide a historical survey of United Methodist Women and its predecessor organizations and amplify the voices that shaped the work through an overarching story of United Methodist Women changing the fact of mission.

The repeat study for 2019 is the 2018 <u>Adult Issue Study</u>: What About Our Money? A Faith Response. What about Our Money? A Faith Response explores how we understand money within the context of our faith. This discussion and our own awareness of how we relate to money can actually help free us from many of the financial dilemmas we face.

You will not want to miss out on these studies, the focus groups, music, enhanced plenary and worship experiences, district fellowships to meet and greet, mission samplers, children's and youth events, and more. And to celebrate the 150th Anniversary of United Methodist Women. What a better place to celebrate our heritage and future than at Mission u 2019!

So mark your calendars for Mission u 2019. Registration information will be available early next spring. I look forward to seeing you at Florida Southern College next July!
