
#### Rainbow Givers



## **Staying in Touch and Active During Challenging Times**

During this time of the pandemic and social distancing, staying connected to our UMW membership is very important. Many of our members live alone and the social distancing aspect of the "new normal" is particularly hard. Here are a few things that our unit has done or is continuing to do to stay in touch.

- On Monday of each week, the unit president collects Joys and Prayers from the membership using email. A prayer list is created and circulated on Tuesday morning. At 10:00 am we join in corporate prayer.
- Care card ministry has been initiated for membership who are in nursing homes or not able to be out and about. Each member of the leadership team is asked to mail at least one card every week to someone on the list.
- Traditionally, we have hosted a reception for the graduating seniors and their families. Since that was not possible this year, we mailed each graduate a Cross in my Pocket prayer and the cross, a "congratulations graduate" face mask and a gift card to Starbucks. Our circles sent a card to each of the graduates. The response was amazing...we made church council with parents sharing how excited their graduates were with the attention.
- Our Unit Reading Chair has made the Book Cart available to members during a designated time period on one day during the week. With the help of the church staff, we have been able to push the cart outside and members can come by and return or check out books.
- We have continued to publish our monthly unit newsletter, the LINK. It is sent electronically to all members with email and sent surface mail to others.
- Our local leadership team and four of our circles have met via zoom.

- With the help of Kim Wendt, VP for the Atlantic Central District, we held a Zoom training for our Leadership Team in July. The next step is a training for individual members on August 25<sup>th</sup>.
- Nine members have sewn over 1450 face masks which have been distributed to five nursing homes, the church family including UMW members and the Florida Children's Home, and 14 community groups such as Partnership for Strong Families, Child Advocacy Center and the homeless center.

#### Upcoming Events via Zoom:

- Planning is underway for our annual Fall Kick-Off scheduled in September.
   Electronic invitations will go to all women in the church and our guest speaker will be our pastor, Rev. Catherine Fluck-Price. We will break into circles during the session so members can do some socializing as well.
- In September/October, *Finding Peace in an Anxious World* will be offered to the entire church as a Wednesday night Mission Study. The eight individuals who have participated in the Conference offered session will provide leadership.
