What do you need to know, as you make your plans not only to Attend but also to give a warm Sunny Florida Welcome to our Global guests?

- First, join the Planning team in prayers through the next 10 months leading to Assembly so all participants may TURN IT UP for justice for women, children, and youth.
- Next complete the volunteer registration form. The form can be found on our Conference website <u>www.flconumw.org</u>. You may also send the attached copy electronically to Judi Levan at <u>judilevan.umw@gmail.com</u>
- Then, register for the event early to save \$35 (See attached chart). Registration will open September 1st.
- Finally, secure your hotel reservation. Assembly participants will receive special rates at the Hilton – \$178 single/double \$198 triple/quad – Hyatt Regency Orlando \$198 – Rozen Center \$174 – Rozen Plaza \$158 (rates do not include applicable state and local taxes)

Note: The Conference has reserved block of rooms at the Hilton Orlando from May 19 through 21. To take advantage of the Conference block rooms, contact Mary Van Tol at <u>maryvantol.umw@gmail.com</u>. Block rooms are allowed for the main event dates only, I do understand some of our volunteers and those attending Ubuntu may need housing prior to Thursday. United Methodist Women Assembly (UMWA) has rooms available for pre/post event dates. Reservations may be made with UMWA directly and will be processed on a first come basis. Those who would like to process their reservations outside of the Conference block may contact Orchid Events Customer Care directly at 888 341-3540 starting September 1st; reservations outside of the Conference block will be processed on a first come basis.

As you decide on how many nights you need to reserve you should know:

- The pre-Assembly event will begin Thursday, May 19, 2022, with the optional Ubuntu Day of Service at 9:00 am. Note there is a \$75 fee to participate in the Ubuntu Day of Service.
- Assembly will begin with Community Gathering every morning at 9:00 starting Friday, May 20
- Assembly will conclude at noon Sunday, May 22, 2022.

Virtual Option: No member will be left behind! For the first time, Assembly 2022 will offer a virtual attendance option for those who are unable to attend in-person. The cost for the virtual event is \$199 for the early registration and \$235 after November 30th.


Do your registration by August 30!!!

In 1898, three-year-old Chinese-American girl Mei Chun Lai is sold to a cruel brothel keeper, where a sympathetic prostitute befriends her. Two years later, at the height of a plague quarantine, a young Methodist woman places her in a home for abused and trafficked girls. The home is destroyed in the 1906 earthquake and fire. Chun (aka "Maud") and a group of seven other Chinese children embark on a cross-country singing tour to raise funds to rebuild. When their home matron suffers a break-down, 13-year-old Maud must lead the band of children home. Based on a true story.














Míssíon u 2021 Celebrates 75th year of Míssíon Education in the Florida Conference!

I cannot begin to tell you the powerful effect of your prayers because, I truly believe our event was transformed by them. Climate Change Effects on Children

Karen McElfish, MD, a UMWomen Program Advisory Group member and a retired pediatrician presented the following at the recent *Just Energy 4 All* webinar (Do Zoom-in the third Wednesday of every month at 3 pm; go to <u>https://www.unitedmethodistwomen.or/just-energy-for-all-webinars</u> to register). Like Karen, let's, you and I, speak out on behalf of the poor, the people of color, and the marginalized who populate the fence-line communities bordering factories and power plants, who live in the inner cities, and who live in polluted environments around the world, to help others understand why climate change is a justice issue.

As temperatures rise due to climate change, what effects does this have on children? Because of their developing bodies and metabolism, their unique behaviors and their dependence on caregivers, children are more vulnerable to the consequences of climate change. It is estimated that almost 90% of the existing global burden of disease attributed to climate change occurs in children under the age of five.

With the burning of fossil fuels, levels of soot and ozone cause air pollution, which contributes to asthma. Children are particularly vulnerable to ozone, because they have developing lungs, breathe faster and spend more time outdoors. Asthma is the most common pediatric chronic disease, affecting almost 10% of American children. As well, with rising temperatures allergy seasons are prolonged, leading to more allergy-related asthma.

As temperatures rise, so do the number of excessive heat days, with increased incidences of death and disability due to heat stroke. Especially vulnerable are children under the age of one and student athletes, such as high school football players. Additionally, the more than 120,000 child farm workers in the US are adversely affected.

Diarrheal illnesses are a leading cause of childhood deaths worldwide. Bacterial infections such as E coli, salmonella and cholera increase with rising temperatures. Changes in precipitation, both drought and heavy rain, disrupt and contaminate water systems, leading to more cases of gastroenteritis.

Vector borne diseases, those carried by mosquitoes and ticks, increase with the expanding range for both vectors and the disease transmitting organisms, due to warmer climates. Cases of Lyme disease, West Nile virus, Dengue fever, and Malaria rise. Again, children are more at risk, due in part to more time spent outdoors.

The increasing number of extreme weather events displace children and their families, often separating children from their caregivers. Education is disrupted, leading to poorer academic performance, absenteeism, and behavioral and mental health issues.

Food security becomes an issue with extreme heat, increased water demands, drought, sea-level rise, and flooding. Food production is decreased and the nutritional value of foods change, for example with lower zinc and iron in grains. These nutrients are important for growth and development. Childhood undernutrition increases, currently at more than 3 million deaths in children under the age of five and projected to increase by as much as 20% by 2030.

Children are at risk. Now is the time to combat climate change, to protect them and their future.
