
She and her husband David have been married for 37 years and have a son, David and a daughter, Giselle, who both grew up participating at different UMW events and Mission U.

Danny Davis: Bearing Witness Study Leader (Virtual)

He graduated from High School in Lansing, Kansas and went to Baker University, a United Methodist related college in Baldwin City, KS. He spent 3 years at Baker studying music education with an emphasis in choral music and voice. In 1976, Davis joined the United State Navy as a hospital corpsman. He served in Jacksonville, FL at the Naval Hospital as a surgical technologist; and the Medical Clinic at Mayport Naval Station where he supervised the minor surgery clinic and emergency room

After the Navy, Davis completed his degree studies in Organizational Theory and Management at the Davis School of Business, Jacksonville University. He retired as a teacher in a self-contained autism classroom in the Broward public school system.
