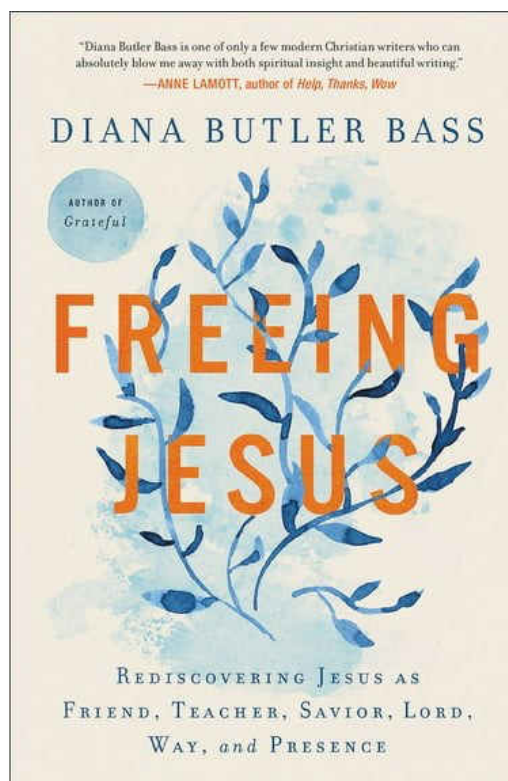
Youth Curriculum: *God With Us: Experiencing God's Presence in Our Lives*
