Mission u 2026: Experiencing Emmanuel



Join us at **Mission u** as we explore the theme, Experiencing Emmanuel. Mission u participants will study the times in the Bible when people experienced Emmanuel, or "God with us." How do we discern God's presence and call on our lives in times of joy *and* in times of sadness, fear, or anxiety? What can we learn from these Emmanuel encounters in the Bible to help inform our discernment to faith, hope, and love in action?

Adult Curriculum: A Deep Knowing: Experiencing Emmanuel Through Every Part of Our Lives



This curriculum is designed to help participants take a step back and a closer look at the various ways we see Emmanuel within and around biblical stories. What can it look like to walk with God as people who face adversity, issues of justice, and a heritage of relational and spiritual connections? This curriculum encourages participants to seek out and name the experiences of Emmanuel from biblical times to our present day as we look toward our future in faith.

Youth Curriculum: God With Us: Experiencing God's Presence in Our Lives



This curriculum invites youth to wonder about where and how God is present in their lives and what that means. God With Us breaks down Biblical characters and stories to explore how God is present in extraordinary and ordinary lives. Throughout, youth will explore how they can encounter God in suffering and tough times, as well as in resistance and our spiritual lineage. By the end, youth will be affirmed and learn the importance of being their authentic, God-created selves.

Children's Curriculum: Experiencing Emmanuel



The Experiencing Emmanuel children's curriculum helps children give voice to the sacred. Faith is a lifelong journey of seeking and naming the presence of God in our lives. Scripture shows us how God's people came to know God and each other—and how those stories shaped their identity. As we interpret these stories, our sense of self and community is formed. This curriculum invites children into that journey and offers a path for children and their mentors to explore faith together, building vocabulary, confidence, and a deeper awareness of God's presence in their lives.

Suggestions for Promoting The Legacy Endowment FUNDOWMENT FUND Fund and Engaging Every Member

*Please share this idea sheet with your entire Mission Team and ask that they help pass it along to their Districts and Local Units!

At Annual Meetings:

- Ask for podium time during meeting to give a Legacy report (or screen time if a virtual meeting)
 - Make report uplifting and lively. You may want to ask other members of your Legacy
 Team to report with you.
 - Give the updated amount donated to Legacy by your conference since inception and celebrate. Then give total given by your conference in 2025 – celebrate how close you are to making your 2025 giving goal and encourage gifts to make or surpass your goal.
 - Give total of Endowment and celebrate how close we are to the goal of \$60 mill.
 - Promote the three giving categories (focus mostly on planned gifts this year).
 - Legacy Builders monthly giving.
 - Friends of Legacy major gift pledges
 - 1869 Society planned gifts (mention planned giving pages on United Women in Faith website)
 - You may want to ask members to stand who give in each of the above categories so that they can be recognized and thanked.
 - Ask if you can hold an Estate Planning Workshop as part of Annual Meeting (can
 present yourself with PowerPoint slides provided by National Office, National Office
 staff could Zoom in to present it, or staff may be able to visit your conference to give
 workshop in person)
 - Mention that there will be a Legacy Banquet at Assembly next year and that there will be Legacy Awards given to the conference that holds the most Estate Planning Workshops, Closes the most Planned Gifts with LOI, and most Legacy Builders.
 - Have a time when you ask for donations to The Legacy Endowment Fund (use attached slide with QR code and text-to-give information)
 - If you have not done so yet, play the Giving Jeopardy game as a group (PowerPoint version available upon request)
 - Invite a National Office Development Staff member to visit your meeting and speak.
 - Refer to a Legacy Response article and pass out copies
 - Ask a respected member to give a short testimony on why she gives to The Legacy Endowment Fund or show optional donor video
 - If your conference has an E & I Coordinator, consider reporting together so that she can promote the importance of Mission Giving as well.





United Women in Faith Legacy Fun-Raising Events

Bake Sale: Organize a bake sale where volunteers bake and sell homemade treats like cookies, cupcakes, and brownies. Consider adding a theme or specialty items to attract more customers.

Garage Sale: Gather donations of gently used items from and host a garage sale. Promote the sale through social media, community bulletin boards, and local newspapers.

Cook-Off Competition: Organize a cooking or baking competition where participants showcase their culinary skills. Charge an entry fee for contestants and sell tickets for spectators to taste and vote for their favorite dishes.

Movie Night Fundraiser: Host a movie night screening at a local venue or outdoors. Sell tickets that include snacks and beverages, and consider partnering with a business for sponsorships or donations.

Themed Dinner Party: Organize a themed dinner party or potluck where guests contribute dishes based on a specific theme (e.g., Italian night, BBQ bash). Charge an entry fee and include entertainment or activities related to the theme.

Board Game Tournament: Organize a board game tournament with various games for participants to compete in. Charge an entry fee or accept donations, and provide prizes for the winners.

Gardening Workshop: Offer gardening workshops or plant sales where participants learn about gardening techniques, plant care, and sustainable practices. Sell plants, seeds, or gardening kits as part of the fundraiser.

Pet Photo Contest: Organize a pet photo contest where pet owners submit photos of their furry
