Founded in November 2024, Peacemaker At Home Care is Paul and Angela's way of honoring the generation that shaped them. "Both of my grandfathers were entrepreneurs," Paul shares. "Peacemaker is a nod to both of them and a way to give back to the generation that gave us so much." The company's mission is simple but powerful: to provide the best care with the best caregiver for the best clients. Peacemaker At Home Care offers licensed and insured assistance with daily living tasks such as bathing, dressing, mobility, meal prep,

laundry, light housekeeping, medication management, and—perhaps most importantly—companionship. They serve aging adults and individuals with disabilities, focusing on reliability and continuity of care.

What sets Peacemaker apart is their philosophy of being "surrogate children" for their clients. "We're not here to replace the family caregiver but to support them," Paul explains. "Sometimes a senior has one family member carrying the responsibility, or they're aging alone. We can be that surrogate—helping with medical

appointments, social outings, and daily care—so seniors maintain their dignity and independence."

Peacemaker also enriches Louisville's community fabric by keeping seniors engaged in local life. Whether attending church, revisiting favorite restaurants, or simply sharing stories from the past, Paul sees firsthand how these connections keep people vibrant. "I'm proud to serve a former teacher from Flaget High School, a nurse manager from St. Anthony's, and a gentleman who grew up in Germantown when there was still a dairy farm there," he says.

Clients echo that impact. Wayne T. shares, "I appreciate the communication. Paul and his caregivers are responsive to our needs and I never feel like we are out of the loop." Jerry M. adds, "My caregivers do a good job taking me to run errands, going to restaurants, and making sure I am safe. I don't know what I would do if I didn't have them."
