

YCN URGENT OFFICIAL COMMUNICATION

Issued in Furtherance of the Mi-Ko Declarations of 2026 and the Tribal Resolution of 2025

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE — July 17, 2026

This communication is issued in direct furtherance of the Yowani Choctaw Nation Public Statement on Government-to-Government Relations, Sovereignty, and Direct Communications. The Yowani Choctaw Nation (YCN) reaffirms its inherent and pre-existing sovereignty, its permanent rejection of federal recognition, and its demand for direct, secure, high-level government-to-government relations with the United States.

It has now been confirmed for more than four months that a clandestine operation, publicly framed as “countering trafficking,” has been conducted as a cover to target the Yowani Choctaw Nation and its War Chief specifically because of the Nation’s assertions of sovereignty and its refusal to subordinate its jurisdiction to federal administrative processes.

The War Chief has been subjected to sustained starvation, financial sabotage, interference, and harassment. This campaign has included theatrical operations deliberately staged to convince the War Chief that he faces imminent assassination on his own properties. At the same time, other factions have carried out actual assassination attempts against the War Chief on more than eighty documented occasions. The most recent attempt occurred yesterday, July 16, 2026.

The War Chief formally requested secure accommodations from the United States Marshals Service. He was instead directed to a VA shelter despite not being homeless. During one such incident, the War Chief directly observed suspected individuals involved in these matters entering and leaving a federal building.

The War Chief has requested assistance from the Executive Administration, the Department of Justice, the Department of Defense, relevant Agencies, and external partners. He has been explicitly told that he is to serve as “bait” for the operation, even though he never agreed to any such role. The YCN states unequivocally that any cooperation whatsoever must occur exclusively through high-level, secure government-to-government channels with the duly authorized leadership of the Nation.

The War Chief has also been subjected to recent harassment in the form of solicitation for prostitution, despite the knowledge of those involved that he has been rendered unable to access his bank accounts due to financial sabotage. He has further been presented with setups framed as offers of assistance or help that, in reality, function as legal traps intended to manufacture grounds to implicate or detain the War Chief.

The War Chief maintains a perfect criminal record, a perfect driving record, and held a Department of Defense security clearance for more than ten years without incident.

At this time the War Chief is suffering from a slipped disk, has no food, is sleeping on the ground, and is experiencing significant mobility issues. Federal authorities have provided no meaningful assistance and have instead instructed him to call 911, contact family, or reach out to non-profits and churches.

Reports from the Yowani Sovereign Security Forces of Strategic Communication and Intelligence make clear that two distinct dynamics are operating in parallel: one faction is primarily focused on mapping trafficking networks through surveillance, driven by institutional promotions, ego, and professional pride; other factions are actively fighting for territorial control of those same trafficking networks under the guise of the clandestine infiltration operations.

The public must be made aware of these facts. According to Yowani Sovereign Security Forces assessments, more powerful and better-resourced factions are already positioned to assume control. The projected outcome is expanded federal control over the Americas accompanied by increased trafficking operations.

Accordingly, the Yowani Choctaw Nation urgently calls upon the Government of the United States to:

- Immediately establish direct, secure, high-level government-to-government communication channels with the duly authorized leadership of the YCN, as previously demanded.
- Provide appropriate protection and secure accommodations to the War Chief consistent with his status and the documented threats against him.
- Conduct a full, independent investigation into the referenced clandestine operations, the more than eighty assassination attempts, the theatrical operations, the financial sabotage, the legal traps, and the treatment of the War Chief.
- Immediately suspend all unauthorized federal activities within territories claimed by the YCN until lawful government-to-government agreements are executed.
- Address the War Chief’s current humanitarian and medical needs arising directly from these circumstances, including treatment for his slipped disk, provision of food, and safe shelter.
- Cease any further use of the War Chief as “bait” or any similar role without express, high-level government-to-government authorization.

The Yowani Choctaw Nation maintains that continued failure to engage through proper government-to-government channels, combined with the ongoing persecution of the War Chief, is inconsistent with the Nation’s interpretation of YCN law, applicable principles of United States federal Indian policy, and international legal principles concerning Indigenous peoples and self-determination.

The War Chief and the Yowani Choctaw Nation remain committed to resolving all disputes through peaceful, lawful, and respectful government-to-government dialogue consistent with the Nation's asserted sovereign status. This commitment, and the Nation's rejection of federal recognition, remains permanent and will not change.
