

## Two Plaques Sought By Groups In Pit

GREENVILLE, June 10 — At a meeting of the Pitt County Commissioners yesterday, two organizations asked the commissioners for appropriations for plaques.

S. A. Whitehurst and Phil Goodson Jr., representing the American Legion, asked for an appropriation for a plaque honoring servicemen who gave their lives either in World War I, World War II, or the Korean conflict. The board told the two men to file a budget request for the plaque so action on the matter could be taken.

The second request came from the Pitt County Historical Society, through their representatives Miss Tabitha DeVisconti and Judge Dink James, who requested \$2,800 for a plaque to be erected in the Courthouse. This plaque will honor the Pitt County Declaration of Independence, which was actually drawn up and signed prior to the American Declaration of Independence. No action was taken by the Commissioners at yesterday's meeting.
