

Historical Research Stressed By Speaker

GREENVILLE, Oct. 31.—D. L. Corbett, of the North Carolina Historical Society, at the Pitt County Historical Society's fall meeting at Sheppard Memorial Library Thursday night, spoke on historical research.

Judge C. V. Cannon of Ayden, who presided, presented the speaker.

Corbett explained to the local group what can be done in various communities toward assembling and compiling bits of valuable North Carolina history. He enumerated some of the projects being conducted, showed some pamphlets and booklets describing historical projects and answered numerous questions.

Dr. Howard B. Clay of East Carolina College faculty suggested encouraging high school groups to dig up bits of history and award prizes for worthy contributions. Dr. Paul Murray of the college faculty praised the movement to emphasize the teaching of North Carolina history in the schools.

Tabitha M. DeVisconti of Farmville, secretary of the Pitt County Historical Society, spoke briefly in outlining the society's objectives.
