Giving Thanks.....

Introduction:

This once again is the season for us to give thanks, but let's be clear that giving thanks is not a seasonal affair but should happen year round. Giving thanks is not just verbal but the hope that giving thanks becomes a lifestyle. All of us have reasons to give thanks and if we are honest the list is endless.

We are thankful for the following:

- * A relationship with Jesus Christ
- * Understanding that we will spend eternity with Jesus
- * We are forgiven for our sins
- * That God hears and answers our prayers
- * That the earth is not our home, but our eternal resting place is in heaven
- * That we have the gift of the Holy Spirit (which guides and leads us)

We are also thankful for:

- * Life, health and strength
- * Protection and provision
- * The ability to walk, talk, hear, see, taste and smell
- * Having a home to live in and a loving family
- * Understanding that God has given us more than we could ever imagine
- * That God still allows for our dreams to come true

Thanksgiving-is a natural response to blessings, protection or love. In the Judeo-Christian tradition, thankfulness is not a tool use to manipulate the will of God. It is never coerced or fabricated in one's mind; rather, gratitude is joyful commitment of one's personality to God.

In the Old Testament, gratitude or thanksgiving to God was the only condition isn which life could be enjoyed. For Jews, every aspect of the creation provided evidence of God's lordship over all life. The Hebrew people thanked him for the magnificence of the universe (Psalm 19:1-4, 33:6-9, 104:1-24). When they received good news, they thanked him for his goodness and great deeds (I Chronicles 16:8-12). When they received bad news, they also gave thanks, trusting that he was a just God (Job 1:21). The magnificence of the universe:

Give praise to the Lord, proclaim his name; make known among the nations what he has done. Sing to him, sing praise to him; tell of all his wonderful acts. Remember the wonders he has done, his miracles and the judgements he pronounced. I Chronicles 16:8-12

Thanksgiving even for bad news:

At this, Job got up and tore his robe and shaved his head. Then he fell to the ground in worship and said: "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked I will depart. The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; may the name of the Lord be praised. In all this, Job did not sin by charging God with wrongdoing. Job 1:20-22

Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know the testing of your face produces perseverance. James 1:2

Learning to give thanks in all seasons is important for the child of God. Many of us believe in giving thanks, but if we are truthful we do not mind giving thanks when all is going well for us. How does the believer embrace every season and learn that giving thanks can happen all the time?
