Nainativu - A Brief Background

- Nainativu is a historic beautiful small island in the north of Sri Lanka
- ► It is approximately 4 square kilometres (4.1L x 1.2W)
- ▶ The total population of the island is around 2,500
- There are three Grama Niladhari divisions and one local government sub office
- There are three government schools on the island
 - Nainativu Maha Vidyalayam (Secondary School up to GSC A/L)
 - Nainativu Sri Ganesha Kanista Mahavidyalayam (Secondary School up to GCE O/L
 - Nainativu Nagapooshani Vidyalayam (Primary School)
- ▶ There is a Divisional Hospital and a Ayurvedic Hospital
- ► There is a second class Post Office
- There are a number of Saiva Temples including the world famous Nagapooshani Amman Temple
- ► There is a Buddhist Temple, a Islamic Mosque and a St Antony's church
- ▶ The main focus for Nainativu citizens is to educate their children
- Main contributors to the economy are farming, retail and fishing
- ► Transport from the mainland to Nainativu is by boat or ferry
- Local modes of transport are by bicycles, motorbikes and three wheelers (10 -15 years ago, carts were the main mode of transport)

The Buddhist temple has links with the second visit of Buddha to Sri Lanka


Although Nainativu may have a small population, of those that had the privilege of education almost one in every family are educated to a high standard


Objectives of NMWA


- ► To be activate and bring together the people of Nainativu living across the United Kingdom

- ► To offer help and support to Tamil's living in other-parts of Sri Lanka in the event of emergencies e.g flooding, natural hazards etc.


Events Organized by NMWA in the UK for Nainativu People, Friends and Well-wishers

Nainativu Alankulam Road Development Project


- During the war time, the main road of Nainativu was blocked by the Sri Lankan navy and people used Alankulam Road for access to the South of Nainativu.
- Roads in Nainativu were not maintained by the local authorities for a long time and the condition of the Alankulam road got worse
- Considering the importance of the development of Alankulam Road, Nainativu Socio Economic Education and Cultural Development Society- Colombo initiated the Alankulam Road Development Project.
- NMWA contributed £5,000 for the development of Alankulam Road considering the importance of this road as an accessible pathway for our people.
- The usage of this road is normally high during the Nagapooshani Amman temple festival season.

Nainativu Educational Project

Considering the importance of education for children who cannot afford it, our charity has decided to establish a tuition centre to provide free tuition classes for those students in Nainative.

We added more classrooms to cater the increased number of students and established separated computer room for free computer education for the students.

The success of the project is identified by the increase in the number of students and by the increase in the number of students passing their year 5 scholarship exam and other government exams.

Accordingly, our charity purchased land in Nainativu and built a tuition centre in 2006. However, due to the escalation of the war situation in Sri Lanka, we were not able to continue the project.

The building was renovated in 2015 and started free tuition classes for poor students in Nainativu in July 2015.

We raised donations from members and well wishers for the project and we spent around £35,000 for the project. The monthly payment for the staff and centre maintenance paid by the charity with donations from committee members of the charity atm.

Two students who studied at our tuition class obtained marks above the district cut out.

We have a plan to establish a library and start vocational training courses for school leavers in the future.

Planting Trees in Nainativu



Our charity has decided to plant trees in Nainativu to safeguard the water resources and soil of Nainativu.



Accordingly, we planted a vast number of trees in Nainativu and a considerable amount of trees grew well. However, we had difficulties maintaining the trees until a certain level of growth.



Mr Perinpanathan (Nathan Annan) has been very helpful with our Tree Planting projects and he is currently planting trees in Nainativu with the support of NMWA



Considering the maintenance issue, we contacted community centres in Nainativu with a WIN-WIN proposal and all community centres agreed to the proposal and with their support we aim to plant trees all over the island and look to do this soon.



We have plans to expand our tree planting project to the costal areas to safeguard our village from marine erosion.

Our charity established Aputhiran Farm for Visually Handicapped People in Vanni, Sri Lanka. This project was designed with two phases:




Initial: We spent around £36,060 to provide infrastructure facilities and purchase cows so that the milk could be sold, and the profits would go to help the visually handicapped in Vanni.





Present: Now, we have decided to handover the project to the Association for Visually Handicapped people to operate the farm with the income received from the farm and get support from other donors for the next stage.























Nainative New Hospital Project



Nainativu Hospital is a Divisional Government Hospital. However, the hospital building, and facilities are not maintained properly by the government



There are no permanent doctors or nurses in the hospital.

- There was a proposal given by Germany Red Cross to build a New Hospital with all facilities and the support of donations from charities and the German Government.
- Accordingly, we contributed £17,500 to the Germany Red Cross.
- However, the Germany Red Cross were unable to secure support from the German Government to build a new hospital in Nainative, Sri Lanka.
- Therefore, they have decided to collect funds from other donors and complete the new hospital project stage by stage. Initially, they plan to build OPD.
- We are waiting until 31 December 2019 to decide whether to go ahead with the project. The Germany Red Cross need at least another € 150,000 to build the OPD.

Relief for Flood Affected People in the North and East of Sri Lanka

- ► There was a heavy flood in the North and East of Sri Lanka in December 2019 and NMWA has decided to help the flood affected people in the North and East of Srilanka.
- ▶ We gave £2,500 (LKR 591,250) to donate goods for war affected people.
- ► LKR 391,250 worth of goods distributed among the flood affected people in North of Sri Lanka through Tamil Virudcham Organization.
- LKR 200,000 worth of gods distributed among the flood affected people in East of Sri Lanka through the Tamil National Alliance Member of Parliament Mr Seeniththamby Yogeswaran.
