Post-COVID, the rising cost of care has placed immense strain on middle-class families. many of whom don't qualify for subsidies and are left to choose between quality care and affordable care. At The Play Lab, we are committed to closing this gap by providing high-quality, childcentered, play- and nature-focused programs, alongside family engagement and collective care. Our goal is to ensure that every child and family receives the support they need to reach their full potential.

In fact, 30% of the children in our program attend with full scholarships, ensuring that financial barriers do not prevent access to the care and education every child deserves.

We also recognize the unique needs of our neurodivergent children, who often face additional barriers in traditional educational settings. At The Play Lab, we are deeply committed to creating an inclusive environment that embraces and supports these children, ensuring they are able to fully engage in their community. We provide tailored programming and resources that help neurodivergent children thrive, empowering them to actively participate in all aspects of their education and development.

Through our comprehensive programming, mentorship, and holistic support, we strive to create an environment where all children, regardless of their developmental needs or economic background, have the opportunity to reach their full potential.



We offered diverse, child-centered experiences, including visits to the library, Wonder Works Children's Museum, the Gymnastics and Recreation Center, and bi-monthly music therapy sessions, supporting holistic growth and exploration for every child.

Provide Collective Care, Meeting the Needs of Staff, Children, and Families

Progress/Outcome:
We supported staff with shortened hours, team meetings, and additional support staff to prevent burnout. Families benefited from monthly engagement activities, weekly Learning Lab newsletters, and bi-annual home visits, fostering strong connections and continuity in care.


