Background:			
The ADA Treasurer's 2024 report documented that membership peaked in 2005 and has been in decline ever since, warning that the Association's market share could fall below 40 percent in the next five to ten years if no corrective action is taken (2024 House of Delegates – Report of the Treasurer, page 7). The report further emphasized that such a decline would undermine the ADA's ability to be the leading voice of oral health in the United States (2024 House of Delegates – Report of the Treasurer, page 7). Membership growth and retention are stated priorities in the ADA's <i>Common Ground 2025: Strategic Plan</i> (ADA Strategic Plan 2020–2025, page 3), which calls for "increased participation" and "broader representation" to strengthen the Association's leadership position.

- 4 down" as they pass through caucus or constituent review. This can strip away urgency, blunt
- 5 innovation, and discourage participation. Allowing any three members in good standing to co-
- 6 submit a resolution directly to the ADA House of Delegates while keeping existing
- 7 procedural safeguards like formatting requirements, deadlines, and reference committee review
- 8 would protect the integrity of member-driven proposals, broaden engagement, and send a
- 9 clear message that every member's voice matters.

- in the Manual of the House of Delegates be amended as follows (additions underlined, deletions
- marked with strikethrough):
- 14 Items of Business
- An item of business becomes the property of the House of Delegates and is subject to House
- action in accordance with the appropriate order of business and agenda schedule when such item
- is received in writing by the American Dental Association Executive Director (Secretary of the
- House) subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. Reports and resolutions from Association agencies, constituent and component societies, trustee districts, individual delegates, and any three members in good standing are governed by the Association Bylaws and the Manual of the House of Delegates. The three members in good standing submitting a resolution shall have the option to request formatting support from their state constituent or their leadership and the American Dental Association. Any suggested changes by state or constituent leadership or the American Dental Association shall be limited to formatting or order, must be presented as suggestions only, and shall not be incorporated without the agreement of the submitting members prior to submission.
 - 2. Resolutions from dental agencies not part of the American Dental Association may become items of business at the discretion of the House if received in writing by the Executive Director (Secretary of the House) at least 15 days in advance of a session.
