A walk-through of our charming community is scheduled for on February 25th. This event is a wonderful opportunity for all of us to ensure that our neighborhood remains a stunning and inviting place for everyone. To achieve this, we have outlined some key recommendations to help keep our community looking its best:

Roofs: Please ensure they are clean and sparkling. A wellmaintained roof significantly enhances the overall appearance of your home.

Driveways: Make sure they are free of weeds and oil stains. A clean driveway greatly boosts curb appeal.

Lawns: Make sure they are free of white clover by using a little weed and feed. A lush, green lawn is a key part of our community's charm.

Pavers: If any pavers are dislodged, kindly reposition them. Replace any missing pavers to keep pathways neat and safe. **Plants and Shrubs:** Give them a nice trim to keep them healthy and looking tidy.

Palm Trees: Trim them well and remove any dead fronds. This helps maintain both safety and aesthetics.

Garbage Cans: Ensure they are not visible from the street, as per City Code. This helps keep our streets clean and orderly.

Side of the House: Keep items out of sight from the street to maintain a neat appearance.

Neighbor's Wall: Ensure that nothing is placed against your neighbor's house wall to respect their space and property.

Perimeter: Nothing should be growing in the hedge. A well-maintained hedge adds to the community's beauty.

Palm Trees and Trees on NW 108th and/ or Johnson: These should be trimmed and neat, ensuring they do not overhang the sidewalk to guarantee safety and accessibility
