In India a Community College is a Post Secondary Institution Focused on a job oriented education offering courses of 6 Months to 2 years duration, general and skill based learning, unlike a traditional university it is designed for local communities to provide skills for immediate employment remedial degree, and lifelong learning opportunities.

The scheme was officially launched in the 12th five year plan and aims to make higher education more relevant and accessible.

Community College vs University

Community College offer two-year Associate degrees and certificates with lower tuition open admissions and smaller classes often acting as a bridge to four-year institutions.

Generally Universities are typically four year costlier institutions offering bachelor's Masters and PhD degrees with competitive admissions on campus housing and extensive research opportunities.

Degree & Duration: - Community Colleges focus on 2 Years associate degrees or Vocational Certificates, while University focuses on four year bachelor degrees.

Cost: - Community College tuition generally much lower, often allowing students to complete their first two years of general education credits before transforming to a 4 years education leading to degree.

Goal: - Community College often cater to working adults career training, or academic preparation, where as universities focus on specialized academic and research based education.

Students often choose community Colleges to save money on tuition and lower-level classes with intention of transforming credits to a 4 year University later.

Earning a low-cost associate degree from Community College means taking pre requisites for 4 year bachelor degree of the university.

The UGC launched a scheme on skills development based higher education as a part of college/university education leading to bachelor of vocation B.VOC (Bachelor of Vocational Studies) which combines general education with specific job roles and National Occupation Standards (NOS) allowing students to gain practical skills for immediate employment or entrepreneurship.

The UGC mandates that Higher Education Institution (HEIS) can embed internships into degree programs to enhance employability and helps bridge the gap between the skills demanded by industries and the skill possessed by the workforce. Vocational Education programs Vocalizes on teaching students trade skills that they can immediately apply to a specific job. These could include technical skills for jobs like Plumbers, Electricians Allied Health Technician and Alike Professional Workers.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) approves Various Skill Based Vocational Education & Training Courses often integrated into Schemes like the B.VOC (Bachelor of Vocation) and **Community College of Programs** these courses are designed for employment and cover a wide range sectors including I.T. India and retail Management and are often developed in constitution with industry and aligned the NSQF (National Skill Qualification Framework)

The UGC has Launched a scheme on 27feb. 2014 for skill development based higher education leading to bachelor of vocation (B.VOC) degree with multiple entry and exit points considering the implementation Mode liters the guidelines of the scheme have been revised in the year2015 according to Guidelines and approval/confirmation for the establishment of UGC Skill based Vocational Education Institutional/Organization the government/ Society/ Trust of Company may also set up an independent the scheme and may offer courses as per the extant guidelines. The financial assistance to such community colleges will be governed as per prevailing policy of the Commission.

Equivalence of B. Voc. Degree

UGC, New Delhi (D.O.No.F.2 - in its circular 7/2014 (CC/NVEQF/Misc./dated 04. August 2016) informed that B.VOC. Degree is like any other Bachelor Degree. Further, it clearly states that (i) Bachelor of Vocation (B.VOC.), a Bachelor level degree specified by UGC under section 22 (3) of UGC Act, 1956 and notified in official Gazette of India dated 19th January, 2013 be recognized at par with the other Bachelor level degrees for competitive exams conducted by Union/State Public Service Commission, Staff Selection Commission or other such bodies where the eligibility criteria is "Bachelor Degree in any discipline"; and (ii) Students with B.VOC. Degree should be considered eligible for the trans-disciplinary vertical mobility into such courses where entry qualification is a Bachelor Degree without specific requirement in a particular discipline.



Degree with multiple exit options such as Diploma/Advanced Diploma under the NSQF. The B.Voc. programme is focussed on universities and colleges providing undergraduate studies which would also incorporate specific job roles and their National Occupational Standards (NOSs) alongwith broad based general education.

In order to, look into new developments and consider the candidates passing out of B.Voc. Degree Programme as per eligibility requirements, it is requested to implement the following:

- (i) Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.), a Bachelor level degree specified by UGC under section 22(3) of UGC Act, 1956 and notified in official Gazette of India dated 19th January, 2013 be recognised at par with the other Bachelor level degrees for competitive exams conducted by Union/State Public Service Commission, Staff Selection Commission or other such bodies where the eligibility criteria is "Bachelor Degree in any discipline".
- (ii) Students with B.Voc. Degree should be considered eligible for the trans disciplinary vertical mobility into such courses where entry qualification is a Bachelor Degree without specific requirement in a particular discipline.




