
Upcoming Rally Hosts

Welcome to all of our new Roamers! Wow – what a year that we have had together exploring various areas of our beautiful state, and enjoying each other's company. I am certainly proud to be one of your officers and happy to start having my very own corner within the newsletter. As many of you know, I am a retired mechanical engineer, and I like to tinker on things. So, my focus while I'm sitting in my corner will be to educate our members on things that are important to me, and hopefully, you as well after reading. With so many new FMCA members joining our chapter this year, perhaps a good start for my writing would be to have a discussion on the benefits (included in your yearly dues) and discounts that FMCA has negotiated for the members.

The hyperlink to the benefits page is <u>FMCA Family Member Benefits | FMCA</u> and include FMCAssist, Tech Connect, Family RVing Magazine, FMCA University, Advocacy, Anti-Theft Decal, Membership Plates, and the Mobile App. I will not go into detail on all of these as you can read about each benefit on the FMCA website, but will briefly discuss the FMCAssist and FMCA University benefits.

FMCAssist is emergency medical evacuation and repatriation coverage that is available to members worldwide as long as you are more than 75 miles from home; for those members that are full-time, you are also considered more than 75 miles from home. So what services are provided as part of the FMCAssist program?

- Medical Evacuation and Repatriation
- Return Home
- Family Travel Expense
- Return of Mortal Remains
- Return of Dependent Children
- Recreational Vehicle/RV Return (limited to trips in North America only)
- Return of Private Passenger Automobile (limited to trips in North America only)
- Pet Return
- Prescription Medication and Glasses Replacement
- Accidental Death and Dismemberment Benefits
- Emergency Cash and Emergency Room Cash Benefits

As you will learn by attending an FMCA Rally, is that besides having fun and fellowship with more FMCA chapters, is that FMCA is big on educating its members via the numerous seminars that they offer. To that end, the FMCA University is an online hub of RVing resources that members can access 24/7 – anytime, and from anywhere. Having RV problems on the Road? Need to consult an RVing how-to article? Want a guide about winterizing your RV or best times for RV repairs? All of this and more are available at FMCA University Library - Family Motor Coach Association

The hyperlink to the discounts pages is <u>Top Choice for RV Discount Clubs</u> | <u>FMCA</u> and include the FMCA Tire Savings Program, FMCA Roadside Rescue, Insurances (RV, Auto, Home, Travel, Pet and Health), Camping Fee Discount Programs, and RV Travel Services including RV Tours, Windshield Replacement, Battle Born Batteries, Mail Forwarding, Fuel Discounts, etc. Personally, for me, we initially joined FMCA just to take advantage of the tire discount for my truck. When we joined in 2021, I took advantage of the Michelin Advantage Program, as Michelin is the only tire manufacturer that has the size tire that my truck utilizes, which are Michelin XRV 255/80 R22.5. As I write this, the program savings per tire is \$114.27, so if we had joined this year, our initial FMCA membership would have generated \$685.62 in savings to us – which is a nice return on our "investment" in joining!

We are already members of Harvest Host and this year also took advantage of SoftStart which enables our air conditioners to start up on up to 70% less electricity – which is essential on those hot summer days when only 30amp

service is available for our 50amp 5th wheel which enables us to run two (2) of our air conditioners. Another discount we took advantage of this year is that of the FMCA Roadside Assistance Program. Benefits of this discount program are:

- Towing to the nearest qualified repair center
- Fuel delivery
- Lockout service
- Tire change
- Battery boost
- Tech assistance

The yearly cost for towable RVs is \$129 which also includes your towing vehicle (up to, and including a Class 5 truck like we have), and \$159 for motorized RV's and your Toad. You can read more about this service here RV Roadside

Assistance - RV Service | FMCA, which also compares itself to other similar programs that are available.
