PHILIPPIANS 3:7-14

(But) whatever gains I had, these I have come to consider a loss because of Christ. More than that, I even consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. AMERICAN SAINTS

The United States has produced some remarkable saints in its relatively short existence. On this 4th of July weekend, here is a smattering of wisdom, observations and advice from a few of them.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (1774-1821) was the first American-born saint. (There were others canonized as American saints before her, but they were born elsewhere and came to America as missionaries.)

Be attentive to the voice of grace.

We must often draw the comparison between time and eternity. This is the remedy of all our troubles. How small will the present moment appear when we enter that great ocean.

Blessed are they who wear themselves out for charity.

St. Katharine Drexel (1858-1955) was a wealthy Philadelphia heiress who founded a religious order to serve Black and Indigenous Americans.
