REBUILDING LIVES AFTER DISASTER

KAREN'S HOME WAS UNDERWATER. HERE'S WHAT HAPPENED NEXT...

When spring floods hit Kentucky, Karen watched her home fill with water, mud, and damage she couldn't afford to repair. After applying for help, she was denied FEMA assistance due to a prior owner's flood insurance requirement—leaving her with no clear path forward.

Karen was connected with Faith Responders—an unmistakable God moment - she later expressed. She wasn't asking for everything to be rebuilt, just a way to start.

From there, God provided. Partnering with Centenary Methodist Church in Kentucky and the Mid-South Conference, volunteers came week after week to clean, repair, and rebuild. Many were in their seventies, faithfully serving until her house became a home again. "There are no words that can express my gratitude", shared Karen, "I'm left with 'only God' and testify this to whomever I come in contact with".

ALL IN GOD'S TIMING

When Hurricane Helene struck, seven trees crashed onto the Brown family's home, leaving it unlivable. After spending a year in a FEMA trailer and exhausting all their resources, there was still a lot of work to do.

Through Faith Responders, volunteers faithfully repaired the interior of their home in early 2026. Today, the Browns have a plan, a path and a future as they finish the final touches and prepare to move back home. A little bit of faith goes a long way.



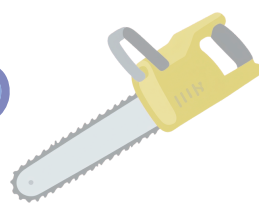
WHAT HURRICANE MILTON TAKES AWAY, GOD RESTORES....

When Hurricane Milton swept through Florida, 77-year-old Martha watched floodwaters rise around her home, unsure what would be left behind. The place remained under water for over a month. The possibility of losing her home became very real. But Martha was not alone.

Through Faith Responders, a team of dedicated volunteers stepped in - and for the next year they showed up again and again. Together, they worked to repair, rebuild and restore what the storm had nearly taken.

What once felt like the end, became a new beginning. Because of faithful hands and hearts, Martha's house is a home again - a reminder that even in the hardest seasons, hope endures.
