- Further medical treatment and supplies provided



#### SPOTLIGHT ON:

#### **Providing Much Needed Medical Care**

Carolyn, Emily, and first-time volunteer Linda Rinard returned to Lemong'o last summer. During their visit, they held two medical clinics that served 325 people. Two Kenyan doctors and one Kenyan nurse traveled to the village to treat the people of Lemong'o. The patients received medical care as well as free medication. When patients were referred for follow-up care, the project funded treatment as well as transportation to the hospital to receive it. Many of the villagers' illnesses are the result of malnutrition and poor hygiene. Common illnesses include: skin disease, diarrhea, flu, malaria, colds, ear and eye infections. The Lemong'o Project provides school lunch to over 500 students each day. Since the school lunch program's initiation in 2010, illness in school-aged children has declined. Each summer fewer and fewer students attend the clinics. Those in need are typically adults and children under 3 years of age. The project provides medical supplies to the school; teachers tend to their students' basic needs throughout the school year.
