FEED HOPE

HELP feed the beautiful children of Lemong'o, Kenya during this time of great crisis with a gift to The Lemong'o Project's **FEED HOPE** campaign.

On Tuesday, December 1, #GivingTuesday, we launched our FEED HOPE campaign which will run until January 1, 2021. The village school, where The Lemong'o Project provides free hot lunches daily to 500+ children, is now closed, and because of social distancing, we are no longer permitted to offer these lunches on school grounds.

Despite this critical challenge, The Lemong'o Project is committed to providing nutritious meals to the children. Working collaboratively with our village leadership team and with permission from the local government, we now are able to distribute food for the children (uncooked maize and beans) directly to families.

To maintain this program, additional funds are <u>urgently</u> needed to feed as many children as possible. With school scheduled to resume in January, we are hoping to be able to continue to provide food directly to families as well as provide school lunch daily.

At a time when we are all experiencing the pandemic, generosity is what brings people of all races, faiths, and political views together across the globe. Generosity gives us all the power to make a positive change in the lives of others and is a fundamental value we all can act on. This is an opportunity for people worldwide to stand together in unity--to use our individual power of generosity to remain connected and heal.

A little truly goes A LONG WAY in Lemong'o - \$2 feeds one child school lunch for an ENTIRE month.






COVID Testimony: Daniel Masaga Karaine
