With everything that has been happening in New Ferry in recent months, we thought we should explain to everyone what is being done to rebuild and improve our community.

The explosion, which happened on 25th March 2017 resulted in 39 casualties on the night. The trauma of the event led to 23 people seeking counselling support set up by the NHS - support which is still on offer for those who need it. Some 32 residential or commercial properties suffered severe structural damage, with 10 of those buildings having to be subsequently demolished. 6 businesses ceased trading immediately, resulting in the loss of 20 jobs. 68 people had to be evacuated from their homes and put into temporary accommodation. 17 homes at Underley Terrace, Boundary Road and Bebington Road are still being repaired at this current time, with those residents still waiting to return home some 18 months later.



HOMES PLAN TO KICKSTART NEW FERRY REGENERATION PROPOSALS

New Ferry recently received a funding boost that could kickstart a new residential-led development, as part of the wider regeneration plan put together after last year's explosion, after it was announced that Homes England would be investing £100,000 to take forward part of the regeneration proposals – providing new homes, car parking and environmental improvements in the Woodhead Street area of the town.

Consultants BDP have now been commissioned by Homes England to undertake this important piece of work, to turn the proposal into a viable, deliverable scheme, capable of securing planning approval and attracting investment from a development partner. This will involve the preparation of the following:

- a residential masterplan and recommended scheme;
- collation of technical information to support a future planning application;
- planning & development brief;
- an acquisitions strategy.

A New Ferry Residential Project Board consisting of representatives from Wirral Council, Homes England and Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy (BEIS) will oversee the progress of the work, with the commission due for completion in early January 2019. As details of the recommended scheme emerge, the proposals will be shared with local residents and the business community to comment on.

ADDITIONAL BID FOR £500,000 FUNDING TO BE SUBMITTED

As well as the Homes England money, the Council has now endorsed a bid for half a million pounds of funding from the Metro Mayor's Town Centre fund to be made to start the regeneration project. More details of what this money will be spent on (if we get it) will be announced in the coming months.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION ON COUNCIL'S LOCAL PLAN

The 'Local Plan' is the policy which guides how an area can be developed; it determines what can be built where and what land should be protected from development. The identification of available land is required to meet the borough's housing need for the next 15 years.

As there are a number of potential sites identified within New Ferry and the immediate area, residents are advised to view the plan and make comments on it.

From early September, a formal, statutory consultation will take place. From that date, the Council will make available a whole host of detailed information related to each site which is affected by these proposals along with details on how you can have your say.

For now, the Council is looking for general views from people about the housing needs of Wirral. You can tell them what you think online or you can call into any Council library or One Stop Shop to pick up a paper copy.

A series of consultation events have been scheduled including one at Hulme Hall on Monday 10th September 2018 with sessions at 10am, 4.30pm, and 7pm.

NEW FERRY TOWN TEAM - WHO ARE THEY AND WHAT DO THEY DO?

The Town Team was established in 2016 with the mission to be a collective group for all community organisations, businesses and residents **to represent the views of New Ferry**, and work together to improve the social, economic and environmental wellbeing of all inhabitants of New Ferry.

Following the explosion in March 2017, funds raised for the relief of both residents and businesses have been distributed through the New Ferry Town Team. Over £10,000 has gone **to New Beginnings New Ferry** to support their work with local residents; over £1,500 has gone to support local businesses, including the printing of the **New Ferry Business Directory**. A second print run will also be funded through the Town Team and copies distributed at the **New Ferry Festival** on 1st and 2nd September.

We supported the successful **Great Get Together** street party on 23rd June both financially and with practical help on the day.

Environmental improvements have included two litter picks in the Shorefields area, in March 2017 and 2018; and also a clean-up of New Ferry Park.

The Town Team have been consulted over the plans for regeneration and is doing its best to represent the collective views of residents and businesses which have been voiced at all the community meetings since the explosion.

On 5th September, some of the team will be travelling to the House of Commons to meet with the new Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government, James Brokenshire, to discuss with him the impact which the explosion has had on our community. We will be taking with us the petition asking for the government to do more to help, and YOUR **impact statements** in which YOU can explain to him how the disaster has affected you and your family. PORT SUNLIGHT RIVER PARK

The River Park now attracts 53,000 visitors annually. In May 2018 it won Health Site of the Year Land Trust Award for its weekly health walks, regular learn to ride children's activities and through the use of the site by numerous walking and running groups and individuals.

Later this year work will start on the **Discovering Bromborough 3** Heritage Lottery Funded project which will see the present site office converted into a heritage centre, with coffee shop, the appointment of an education officer and more archaeological digs at the courthouse leading to this site opening to the public and being connected to the River Park by paths to the new bridge which connects Port Sunlight River Park with Bromborough Pool.

LOCAL GUIDED WALKS IN SEPTEMBER

There are guided walks **for Heritage Open Days of the River Park** on 14th September at 10.30am; and **Bromborough Pool Village**, including, the Courthouse site, on 7th September at 10.30am, meeting in the Garden Centre; and the building in the village will be open for tours on 8th September at 10am, 11am and 12noon.

There will also be the annual guided tour of **New Ferry** taking place on Saturday 15th September. Starts at Bebington Station at 9.30am and takes just over 3 hours to finish at Port Sunlight River Park. No booking necessary; just turn up on the day.
