- Reduce symptoms of treatment-related side effects
- Elevate mood
- Reduce anxiety and depression
- Improve sleep
- Boost energy levels and reduce fatigue
- Maintain physical functioning
- Support bone health
- Improve quality of life



NUTRITION CAN HELP:

- Support faster healing after treatments
- Lower your risk of infection
- Support the immune system
- Build up strength and energy
- Tolerate side effects from treatments
- Maintain a healthy weight
- Replace or retain nutrients that are stored in the body
- Reduce the risk of cancer recurrence
