**Swearing in of New Council Member:** 7:06 PM G. Michael Brady was sworn into office as Councilman Brady.

**Recognized Guests:**

**Nancy Brady** – Friday for Autumn Glory she feels was successful! Has an idea to receive funds for the new Christmas Pole Lights. Suggested we do "Home Tours." To Sell tickets and the proceeds that are raised put towards the cost of the new lights. \*Put an ad in the newsletter to see if anyone would be interested.

**Dale Lipscomb** – The museum had a great turn out for the Autumn Glory Festivities. 32-35 People. Got a \$50 donation and would like to donate it back to the town to go towards the new Christmas Pole lights, from the museum. Dale also Donated \$50 of his own money to go towards the cost of the new lights. The Food drop, they ran out of food.

**Rita Lambka** – Nothing

**Barb McKenney** – Would like to thank everyone for stepping up. Our town and People were great. The last newsletter was great. Suggested we start charging for ads in the newsletter \$10 or so. For the local businesses or possible personal ads. Could the American Recovery Act be considered for the costs of the storm drains?

**Missy Nesselrodt** – Asked that after Justin denied the town council seat, was Josh Vanbrundt considered for the seat? \*Mayor Reckart told her that he was considered, but it was discussed in executive session. \* Then asked why was Mike able to resign and then be asked to get his position back? \*Councilman Brady told her that it wasn't a true resignation, that it was just that his term was up, and he didn't want to cost the town more money by making them have to have another election. \* Stated the reason she voted for Diane and Theresa because she feels that they will push the town forward. Feels that the K.V.F.D. had a good turn out for the Autumn Glory. Also, how many Town applications were received? \*Mayor Reckart told her 15. \*

**Sharon Paugh**- Stated that she wanted to clear a rumor that is going around town. The American Red Cross did not pay for the addition that was put on. The fire department had to get Red Cross Certified and did not get a grant from them. The addition of fire department was added at the cost of loans taken out by the Fire Department. They also have a loan against one of the trucks as well. The Fire Department is fully funded by donations. The fire department also received a grant for "SCBA Packs."

**Lt. Colt Ruby** – 7 Incidents reported for the Month of October. \*Mayor Reckart also requested for police to be there for trick or treat on October 29<sup>th</sup>, 2021. \*

**Diane Kisner** – There were 74 total guests in the Library for Autumn Glory. Had a donation of \$100 towards the Fall Basket, she made to raffle off. The proceeds from that raffle are to go towards the cost

of the New Lights. The library will now be offering knitting lessons & the children's stem class is to continue through the winter. Is there anything as far as lighting in the parking lot at the school, and along the side of the school that we can do? Thomas also stated that out of all of the coins submitted, that Kitzmiller's was the nicest looking one.

**Mike Hechmer** – Nothing

#### **Grants –**

- **Community Legacy** Peggy has a meeting on November 1<sup>st</sup> and will let us know the outcome. This grant is for the sidewalks.
- **USDA** New truck, first round of allotted money is gone. The new round of applications is to be accepted starting October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021. We will revise ours to the new standards and resubmit it.
- **Garrett County Commissioners w/ Project Open Space** POS money will be used to get the pond in the park fixed, 4 new picnic tables will be installed, and new benches. We have been APPROVED for this grant. They will start the process in the Spring.
- **Well Connected Communities** They have received the new paint, new signs, and new octagon picnic tables, and these things will be installed this coming spring. The new Welcome to Kitzmiller sign was installed. Julie Wagner will be down at some point to redo the landscaping. Spoke with Ann, and she said there may be more funding available to projects like these but will get back to us after the meeting is said and done with.
- **American Recovery Act** This is the grant we have received from the Government in the aftermath of COVID. The regulations and guidelines are still being finetuned and until they are 100% sure as to what the funds can be used for, we will not touch the money. We do however know that this money can benefit non-profit organizations in our community. Once we know what/how it can help them, the organization will have to fill out an application and submit it to the council for approval. Will be discussed later on what the funds can go towards.

#### **Old Business –**

- **Street Lights** – Potomac Edison came down and fixed the lights that needed to be fixed. (3 in the park, 1 at Shawna and William's, 1 at Tim Wilt's, & the one next to the Community Building.) The only one that hasn't been fixed is the one next to the community building because they needed to order parts for it.
  - Beccie checked into what is called the Maryland Smart Energy Communities Grant. If we owned the lights on the poles, they would be able to assist us. However, we rent the lights from Potomac Edison, and that instantly disqualifies us for this grant.
- **Code Enforcement** We are still waiting to hear back on the zoning. Our Code Enforcement Officer has reached out to the attorney and hasn't heard anything back from him yet but will update us once we know more.
- **Garrett County Engineer** Still working on the drainage plan on 3<sup>rd</sup> and Church Streets
- **Paving** There were a few spots where Robert was able to fix with cold patch. We will now have to wait on Spring.
- **Alley at Mike Hechmer's** County will bring down the Jersey Barriers when they come to fix the drainage issue, so that way they can make one trip.
- **Personnel Policy** Has been sent to the Attorney and we are awaiting approval.
- **Thrift Store** Will be upstairs at the school. That much was okayed by the fire marshal. However, we will need a new blueprint. Patrick is going to draw up the new blueprint for us. We are currently waiting to see what he comes up with.
- **New Flooring in Office** Still working on cleaning out the office, once it is cleaned out and Allen has a free evening, he will be down to install it.

- **Lucas Dumpster** an Insurance Claim has been filed. There is no deductible. Since the claim has been filed, it is now between the claimant and the insurance company. It is as if we turned it over to the code enforcer and we can not speak on behalf of the insurance company or the claimant. They must deal with each other.
- **Stray Animals Around Town** Animal Control was called and said they would send someone down to take care of the problem.
- **Tree in Front of Don Stiles** Potomac Edison is going to come to check out this tree along with some others. It has been sent off to what they call their forestry department, and they will be reaching back out to the office as soon as possible.
- **Museum** The iron BIRDS that came off with the storm, will be fixed as soon as we get someone hired to be able to properly fix it.

#### **New Business**

- **Sharing and Promoting Elk Garden** Since Elk Garden and Kitzmiller work together to promote each other, why not be able to share things to the town Facebook page about sharing ONLY 21538 zip code. **Diane motioned to make revise the policy for Facebook Approvals; Mike 2<sup>nd</sup>; 4-0**
- **Autumn Glory**
  - **Donations** Sunset Farms – Cornstalks. G<sup>3</sup> Cleaners - \$150, 15 pumpkins, and ribbon to make bows. Summerfield Enterprises – Haybales. Eddie & Danielle Friend – 35 pumpkins. Lowe’s – 19 Smaller Pumpkins. Kuhn’s Korner Thrift Store – 2 Christmas Baskets to Raffle. Diane Kisner – Decorating in front of the School & Fall Raffle Basket. Pritt’s Funeral Home - \$100. Andy Nelson of State Farm - \$250. Teresa Durst – Making all the bows throughout the town. \*Thank you, cards have been, sent to each person/organization have been sent. \*
  - **Financial Outcome** - \$95.88 for the Mums. \$404.12 left over, all agreed to use the remaining funds to go towards the new Christmas Lights.
- **Postage** Right now, going through **USPS** on Average we spend: \$500 Every 2-3 months for Ink, roughly \$200/month. \$58 for 100 stamps. For 287 Newsletters monthly is costs around \$374 and \$4,488 annually. **Pitney Bows Annually** Postage \$1,689.12, Ink \$2,000, Meter \$959.52 = \$4,648.64. **Stamps.com** Postage \$1,689.12, Ink \$2,000, Meter \$215.00 = \$3,905.00. Pitney Bows VS USPS we’d spend \$160 more annually. With Stamps.com, we will save around \$583 annually. **Diane made a motion to sign up for Stamps.com. Sharon 2<sup>nd</sup>. 4-0.**
- **State Highway User Funds** We received a letter from the State Highway User Revenue estimating what the funding would be for the fiscal year of 2022 and 2023. “The Revised HUR estimates for the Town of Kitzmiller for Fiscal Years 2022 and 2023 are \$29,832.66 and \$30,629.92, respectively. Please note that these estimates are based on the most recent registration and mileage data on file. If a change to this data is anticipated for Fiscal Year 2023, you may want to adjust your internal HUR estimate accordingly.” \*Mayor Reckart stated that this is where the primary funding to pay our Maintenance positions comes from. \*
- **Floodwall Inspection** We have not received the official letter of findings. This is our “Unofficial List.” \*Mayor Reckart disclosed that unless the floodwall was literally just built, will never get the top rating. \* There are rocks on the WV side that it looks like they may have been covered up with some dirt somehow, and after the winter, they will be checked to see they need fixed. Someone made “steps” on the WV side, they need to be repaired. The removable swing is allowed to sit on the flood wall, because it is not a permanent structure.
- **Christmas Pole Lights** They are on sale until October 31<sup>st</sup>. We need a total of 10 because all of ours will need to be replaced. Nancy donated \$400 towards new ones from the thrift store. Jo Sheffield (the Auditor) donated \$500. We could get a few new ones this year and get the rest later. We have \$404.12 left from Autumn Glory. Barb asked to buy one for in front of the Restaurant AND WANTS IT

TO BE A SNOWFLAKE, because she doesn't like the other ones. **Theresa made the motion to buy two of each, except the green ones for a total of 10 new Christmas Pole Lights, 2 Candy Canes, 2 Stockings, 2 shooting stars, 2 Candles, 2 Sparkling Snowflakes. Mike 2<sup>nd</sup>. 4-0.**

- **Buildings on Union Street** Peggy will be checking into some grants that may be able to help us with the buildings that are falling on Union Street. The "Strategic Demolition Grant" will start accepting applications in the spring. This will give us time to "get our ducks in a row."
- **LED Street Lights** Oakland had LED bulbs installed in their streetlights and ended up saving 30% on their electric bill. Since our Street account is typically our largest bill that we pay as a municipality, would this be something that the council would consider looking into? **\*Suggested that Beccie call Potomac Edison to determine the costs of having this done. \***
- **November Newsletter** Beccie has compiled things for the upcoming November Newsletter. Veteran's Day Dinner, Special on Isabella Elliott (wasn't included last month because the family wasn't ready yet.) Churches & Organizations have also given their announcements. Is there anything the council would like to include? Any Suggestions on Recognized Residents? **Sharon suggested to recognize the Lions Club for all their help with Betty after her accident. Anonymous suggested David Paugh for helping with path at the park.**
- **Letter from Teresa Durst** Teresa sent a letter from the Veteran's Day Committee asking for a donation for the Veteran's Day Dinner. **Sharon motion to give Teresa & the committee \$100. Diane 2<sup>nd</sup>. 4-0.**
- **Old Fashioned Christmas** Yes or No? The Fire Department is doing Drive-Thru treats with Santa on Friday, December 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021 from 5 PM to 7 PM. **Diane Nye-Paugh motioned that there should be a committee for Old Fashioned Christmas (that she will chair) and that we should have Old Fashioned Christmas on December 10<sup>th</sup> to coincide with the Fire Department. Mike 2<sup>nd</sup>. 4-0**
  - **Barb** suggested that we do Christmas Caroling and she will serve refreshments after. Diane is to add this to the Christmas Committee.



**Members In Attendance:** Councilwoman Theresa Harvey, Councilwoman Sharon Anderson, Mayor Robert Reckart, Councilwoman Diane Dye-Paugh, & Town Clerk, Rebecca Glotfelty.

**Recognized Guests:**

**Lt. Colt Ruby** – Reported 10 incidents for October. Nothing too concerning on his end. Nothing to address. No questions.

**Siera Wigfield** – Senior Planner of “Planning Land Management” Presented the results of the Kitzmilller Rec Survey that was sent out with the Newsletter and shared on social media. There were 700 responses throughout the County as a whole. 37 of those responses were for Kitzmilller. So that resulted in 12% of the population in the 21538-zip code. Among the top Answers from the survey, the citizens in our community would like to see the following. 1.) Update of the Restrooms in the park. 2.) Get Better Lighting in the Park/Surrounding Areas. 3.) New Playground at the School. 4.) New Pavilion Roof. Siera suggested that we paint Mile markers on the River Walk. She will take all this information to her annual meeting and will have a rough draft of what will be discussed in Mid-December. Presentation ended 7:23pm.

**Heather Berg** – Went over the year-end report of what the Health Department & the Empowerment Group has done over the last year for Health Education and the Outreach Division. Things that were covered included obesity, tobacco, alcohol, opioid & prescription drugs, and the increased access to and the use of preventive screening and support services. Education is provided to the community through the Outreach Division. She would like to remind people that if you are wanting to quit tobacco, there are classes available through the Health Department. Prescription drug drop boxes are located at the Oakland Sheriff’s department, in McHenry at the Maryland State Police Barrick, and the Oakland Town Hall. We also have Deterra Pouches for medication disposal available as well.

**Rita Lambka** – Nothing

**Dale Lipscomp** – Nothing. Just that the Museum is cold. The food drop in October was another success. Although they were late. But the Driver got lost.

**Diane Kisner** – The library will have an open house on December the 8<sup>th</sup> from 10A to 3P, providing some goodies. Doing ornaments at Old Fashioned Christmas. The library went back to mandatory masking. They also partnered with the Garrett County Health Department to get 12 COVID tests for people to pick up, and they were gone in an hour and a half. When she receives more, it will work like a drive thru. You will have to call to let her know you are coming, and she will bring the test out to you.

**Missi Nesselrodt** – Has anyone been hired for the second maintenance position yet? *\*Mayor Reckart informed everyone that no, there has not been someone hired. It will be discussed this evening in executive session.\**

**Justin Nesselrodt** – Just wanted to remind everyone in the town with winter approaching, that fire hydrants need

to be clear of any snow. Requested that if there is a fire hydrant near your property to please help keep it clear so if an emergency were to happen, they'd be able to better assist you. Also asked if it was legal to ride Dirt Bikes on the road? Someone from the Maryland Off-road Vehicle Alliance has it on Facebook that we can. Could someone address this? \*Mayor Reckart said he would reach out to them. \* Also, the trees/shrubbery between the school and the pond are getting a little, out of hand. Can we see about getting them trimmed? \*Mayor Reckart asked Justin to give us a quote on how much it would cost, and we could possibly have him do it. \*

**Sharon Paugh** - The Fire Department will have Drive-Thru treats with Santa from 5p to 7p on October 8<sup>th</sup>. Requests that all who are partaking in the event to drive to the end of East Main Street, turn around, and then approach the Fire Department on the right-hand side of the road. Also asked for people not to park in their parking lot. You must have a child in the vehicle to receive a Christmas Treat.

**Heather Berg on behalf of the Empowerment Group** – They will be hosting the Christmas tree lighting for Old Fashioned Christmas, selling bows for the tree, and will have three Door prize baskets to give away. \* Basket Themes: Breakfast, Baking, & Dinner. \*

#### Grants:

**Community Legacy Money** – Peggy has not heard anything back on this grant yet. This is the current application for new sidewalks throughout our community.

**USDA** – Peggy has reevaluated our application to get it submitted.

**Garrett County Commissioners/POS** – We have been approved for the Pond Restoration at the Park. Just waiting on Spring.

**Well Connected Communities** – Landscaping at the new Welcome to Kitzmiller sign has been completed. Justin Nesselrodt is to give us an estimate on Maintaining the landscaping. The tables will be delivered on December 17<sup>th</sup>. Councilman G. Michael Brady will be delivering them. The new STEAM cart has been delivered to the library for use, and it looks awesome! The swings, paint, and chains are all here, waiting to install next spring. Heather Berg, who helps with the funding, is still trying to get Umbrellas for the new Picnic Tables.

**American Recovery Act** – Nothing is certain yet with what these funds can be spent on. However, Mayor Reckart stated that at the monthly Mayor Meeting, it was disclosed that the Fire Department will be able to benefit from this grant. Every municipality in the county will be donating a portion of the funds to their Fire Departments. The grant is almost completed.

#### Old Business:

**LED Lights** – It was a no go for the Grant. Mayor Reckart did receive a call from Potomac Edison to go over the lights with him. Hopefully doing a walk through, they will be able to come up with a solution to help the town save money on the Street Lighting.

**Christmas Pole Lights** – As of today, we need \$0.83 to complete the payment for the new lights. They are to ship on November 29<sup>th</sup>, we have the bucket truck scheduled for Dec. 3<sup>rd</sup> to get the put up. If they do not come by the end of the week, we are scheduled to possibly get it on the 10<sup>th</sup> to get them up before the evening before Old Fashioned Christmas.

**Tree at Don's House** – The power company will be dropping the tree. When they do, the town and/or the resident will be responsible for disposal.

**Postage** – Stamps.com has been set up. Beccie will let everyone know how it works, after the next newsletter.

**Floodwall Inspection** – Still haven't received the Official Report

**Building on Union Street** – It's been turned over to the Code Enforcer, so this can no longer be discussed.

**Old Fashioned Christmas** – It will be on December 10<sup>th</sup> & December 11<sup>th</sup>. December 10<sup>th</sup> - The library will start the day off with their Open House opening from 10A to 3P. The Fire Department will have their Drive-Thru Treats with Santa. Activities at the school will begin at 6P and go until 8P. The Lions Club will have refreshments in the Kitchen. The library will have a place set up for Ornament Making. Santa's Workshop will be in the cafeteria. Kitzmiller Assembly of God will be making placemats. The Empowerment group will be selling bows, giving away 3 door prize baskets. December 11<sup>th</sup> – Storytime with Santa at the coal Bucket, then Community Caroling to follow. Barb will serve treats after for those that participate. There will also be a light contest. Anyone and everyone can vote, as many times as they want. Call the town hall or contact a council member to sign up. The point of the light contest is to encourage everyone to participate in the decorating, and make the kids say "Wow." It will run from December 10<sup>th</sup> to December 20<sup>th</sup>. Polling stations will be located at the Coal Bucket, Town Hall,

Miner's Vault, and Library. Post Office will be having a "Santa's Mailbox" in the lobby for people to send cards to Santa. There will also be a giving tree set up in the post office. There will be tags on the tree of things that people will request. You take that tag, purchase the item, and then return it under the tree.

**New Kitzmiller Sign Landscaping** – Julie Wagner from Julie's Greenhouse sent a team down to complete the landscaping at the new Welcome to Kitzmiller Sign, and it has been completed. It looks amazing! Justin to give an estimate from KJs Landscaping to maintain it.

**Office Flooring** – Finally down. The office has also had a tremendous make over.

**Personnel Policy** – Is in Mike the attorney's "stack" that he will be reviewing soon.

**Storm Drainage/Alley Mike Hechmer's** – Storm Drains – Paul with the county is still working on the plans & waiting until the spring to complete. We will have to figure out how to get the barriers down here now.

#### **New Business:**

**Flooring at Coal Bucket** – The flooring in the kitchen at the coal bucket needs to be replaced. It is severely damaged by wear and tear, and some water damage. Success floor covering came down to give Barb and estimate of \$1,977.64 for it to be fixed properly and to install the new flooring. We budgeted \$1,000.00 for upkeep and repairs to the building. What if something like the furnace breaks and needs repaired? **Diane motioned not to use what was budgeted, but to proceed with the new flooring. We have a CD that just matured, to use the funds from that to pay for the flooring at the Company Store, and the remaining funds to be allocated towards park improvements. Sharon Second. 3-0.**

**Christmas Decoration Lights** – Diane motions to use excess money from Christmas Pole Lights to go towards 6 new sets of solar powered Christmas Lights for the Welcome to Kitzmiller Sign. Then any excess will be sub accounted to be put towards outlets on each pole. Theresa, second. 3-0.

**Tree Behind Assembly of God Church** – Received and estimate of \$2,600.00 from Garrett Tree Removal. Going to look for another tree removal service. Diane Nye-Paugh said she used Kiddy N. Duncun, a company she used personally.

**Chamber of Commerce Email** – The chamber of commerce is looking for a president and is currently taking applications. All interested parties will have to email their resume.

**Petition by Affordable Housing for Garrett County** – Petition to the GC Commissioners on the tax sales of homes in GC. Proposing that (1) The real estate transfer tax on the sales of residential properties valued at \$500,000 or more be increased by 1%; (2) The \$50,000.00 exemption on transfer taxes, now available to all sellers and buyers, be limited to full-time residents only.

**Mountain Maryland PACE** – Mayor Reckart will be attending a meeting on January 20<sup>th</sup> and the 21<sup>st</sup>. These are the people who (1) Write the Grants and (2) Approve the Grants. So, this will benefit our community tremendously.

**December Newsletter** – Anonymous Entry – Carroll Matthews and Barb Coleman for always being positive and caring while providing great senior meals, and always going the extra mile to make the holidays special. We enjoy the meals and the fellowship. Anonymous Entry – K.V.F.D. has gone so many years without missing a call. \*Contact Justin to get the details. \*

**December Meeting – Yay or Nay?** - Diane motioned to forego the December Meeting for 2021. Sharon, second. 3-0.

#### **Council Member Concerns:**

**Diane Nye-Paugh** – Dead trees across from Allan Chadderton's. There are a few that need to come down.

**Sharon Anderson** – Is there a way we would be able to install a streetlight in the "dark space" between Orchard Street and her house? It's dark there during the evening, especially now since the time has changed.

**Theresa Harvey** – The parking at Kristen Michaels' they are always on or over the white line. The stopped vehicles on state street, someone is going to get seriously injured or worse. Also, there were people spotted riding their 4 wheelers on the floodwall again. Is there something that we can do about this?

**Mayor Robert Reckart** – He would like to get the ball rolling on trying to get something established up at the park to honor Dr. Marvin Brown. To be able to give him the credit he deserves for what he has done for the Botanical Garden.
