From the Director's Desk:

Perception versus reality is a lesson with which I seem to struggle. The following story will give you a good illustration. In June, we lost our beloved Piper to an unexpected illness. The pain of that loss is still raw, but after a month and a half of living in a single cat household, Mr. Green and I decided it was time to open our hearts to another kitty. On July 19, we adopted Harpo from the Humane Society in Lima. She fell in love with Mr. Green the minute she met him. I know what that's like, so I knew she had to come home with us. My perception was that our baby Zoey would fall in love with her, too, and our home would be filled with lots of cat harmony. Unfortunately, my perception of what would happen did not match reality. The first two weeks were okay, but then the fights started. Zoey didn't want to share me and she certainly didn't want to share Mr. Green's lap. She didn't want that sweet little Harpo to sit on the cat tree, play with her toys or sleep in our bed. I was devastated. I got a little crazy (Mr. Green would never say that to my



face, but I know he thinks it) and I hired a cat behaviorist. You would not believe the rules we have to follow to create that cat harmony I so long for. We have schedules for cats in separate rooms, how and where to feed them and a laundry list of cat trees, scratching posts and shelves to purchase. Chewy.com is getting a lot of business. Fortunately, Mr. Green knows that being married to me can mean embarking on some wild adventures and he's been on board. Although we have been on program, we still have quite a ways to go to get to that end result.

I tell you this story because I think it is an excellent parallel as to what has been happening here at work. On Thursday, August 20, 2020, Governor Mike DeWine announced that senior centers would be given the green light to open again on Monday, September 21, 2020. We all heard, "OPEN!" Perception has been that this means back to the way things were prior to closure in March. Unfortunately, this is not our current reality. As I write this, we are just now getting the list of mandates that we need to follow in order to open. Some of the protocols are confusing and guidance on how to implement even more so. What I can tell you is that the guidelines are strict because the Ohio Department of Aging and the Ohio Department of Health know that individuals who are 60 years or older are at the greatest risk of serious illness and death due to COVID-19. We know of several people who have gotten it and have come through it fine. Others we know have had to be hospitalized or put on oxygen and are still struggling to regain their health. We have also had to mourn the loss of several individuals we have served over the years. The reality is opening our facility back up is not going to happen by September 21. In fact, I can't give you a date at this time. We absolutely have to make sure that we have the policies and procedures down to a "t" before we can welcome you back. We absolutely have to get with the program. All I ask is for some grace for me and my excellent staff



as we try to navigate these uncharted waters. I promise that perception will someday become reality, but just like with our cats, the process will be measured and methodical and patience will be key.

GARAGE SALE UPDATE

We are very excited to announce the new building is complete and we have started the set-up process! The set-up process looks a little different due to Covid. We have had to change how we are doing things to help with social distancing and keeping track of all people in the buildings at all times. Volunteers will be able to pick a day of the week and time that works best for them to come in and help. We ask that they only come on their scheduled day, wear a mask and maintain social distance. The next garage sale is scheduled October 8 – 10. The new building and the 2 bay

(glassware) will be the only two buildings open. We will continue the sale on October 15 - 17 at which time the 4 bay (books, pots and pans, miscellaneous, etc.) and the 6 bay (furniture) will be open. Thursday's hours will be 8:30 - 6:30. Friday and Saturday's hours will be 8:30 - 4:00. All items in the new building and the 4-bay building will be sold by the bag. We will be setting up the 6 bay (furniture) on Tuesday, October 13. 



OutreachReachin' Out:

Avoid the Double Whammy this Fall!

Per the *American Academy of Family Physician's* advice listed on familydoctor.org.

Pneumococcal vaccines can protect you against getting pneumonia, which is contagious and spreads from close, person-to-person contact. Pneumonia is an infection of the lungs and can lead to many symptoms, including: cough, fever, difficulty breathing, chills, chest pains, and mucus with cough.

For seniors, pneumonia can be very serious and life-threatening. This is especially true if you have a chronic condition, such as diabetes or COPD. Pneumonia can also develop after you've had a case of the flu or a respiratory virus such as COVID-19. It is extremely important to stay current on flu shots each year in addition to your pneumococcal vaccines.

While the vaccine does not protect against all types of pneumonia, it can make it less likely that you will experience <u>severe</u> — and possibly <u>life-threatening</u> — complications from the illness.

So, talk to your doctor to see if the Flu & Pneumococcal vaccine is right for you this fall!
