



Medicare Open Enrollment ends December 7







OutreachReachin' Out:

2021 Medicare Costs

On November 6, 2020, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released the 2021 premiums, deductibles and coinsurance amounts for the Medicare Part A and Part B programs.



<u>Part A</u> – Most people receive their Part A coverage free-of-charge. If you or your spouse did not work the required amount of time to pay qualifying Medicare taxes, you may have to pay a premium.

<u>Part B</u> – The standard monthly premium for Medicare Part B enrollees will be \$148.50 for 2021, which is an increase of \$3.90. The annual deductible is \$203, an increase of \$5.00. Please note, if you did not sign up for Part B when you were first eligible, your monthly premium may go up 10% for each 12-month period you were not enrolled and could have been. In most cases, this penalty will be applied each time you pay your premiums. It is important that you sign up as soon as you are eligible.


<u>Part D</u> – Open enrollment is coming to a close on December 7, 2020. If you don't sign up for Part D when you are first eligible, you may have to pay a penalty. The longer you wait to enroll when eligible the higher the penalty you will eventually pay. Even if you don't take any drugs, you will need coverage and there are plans available that will be less strain on your pocket then a penalty.

Still Working and Drawing Social Security?

The earnings limit for workers who are younger than full retirement age (66 and 2 months for those born in 1955) will increase to \$18,960. (Social Security deducts \$1 from benefits for each \$2 earned over \$18,960.)

The earnings limit for people reaching their full retirement age in 2021 will increase to \$50,520. (Social Security deducts \$1 from benefits for each \$3 earned over \$50,520 until the month the worker turns full retirement age.)

There is no limit on earnings for workers who are full retirement age or older for the entire year.
