Pollinator Flower Beds

THANK YOU to Ryan McMichael, Extension Educator with OSU Extension office of Mercer County, for getting the grant and picking up all of the plants for the three Pollinator Flower Beds that have been planted in front of our building. Thanks to Ryan, Charlene Guingrich, Janet Nelson and Patty Loughrige-Gelhaus for helping plant the flowers which will help support the pollinator species; bees, butterflies and moths in our community. These gardens are planted with native plants. A plant is considered native if it has occurred naturally in a particular region, ecosystem, or habitat without human introduction. Exotic plants that evolved in other parts of the world or were cultivated by humans into forms that don't exist in nature do not support wildlife as well as native plants. Stop by and check out each of these unique gardens. We have flyers that indicate how to identify each plant and give information on how to start your own native plant pollinator garden! Ask for one when you come in the office.


