


Our mission is to help older people live dignified and reasonably independent lives in their own homes for as long as possible.

OSHIIP Medicare Open Enrollment Information Meeting

You are invited to attend a Medicare Open Enrollment informational meeting scheduled for Wednesday, October 8th at 3:00 pm. The session will be hosted by Hannah Black, OSHIIP Community Liaison with the Ohio Department of Insurance.

This meeting is highly recommended for individuals already enrolled in Medicare as well as those approaching their 65th birthday. Participants will receive important updates on changes to Medicare effective in 2026.

The Medicare Open Enrollment period runs from October 15th through December 7th, 2025. Recognizing that Medicare can be complex, our Outreach Specialists will be available to guide you through the process.



MCCoA Medicare Open Enrollment Worksheet - 2026

The Ohio Senior Health Insurance Information Program(OSHIIP) from the Ohio Department Of Insurance recommends that you review your Medicare options **EVERY** year. All Medicare beneficiaries can add, drop or change their health and drug coverage during the Annual Open Enrollment Period.

The Annual Medicare Open Enrollment Period (OEP) is from October 15th - December 7th.
Any changes made during the OEP take effect January 1st of the following year.

This is an important time to make sure that your premiums and drug copays stay in check for 2026!

If you currently get your prescription drug coverage through TRICARE, VA benefits, Federal Employee Retirement Benefits or any employer/union health plan, it is usually best to keep that credible coverage without any changes. You should contact your benefits administrator for information about your current benefits before making any decisions.
