- Learn mindfulness techniques to bring some balance to challenging days

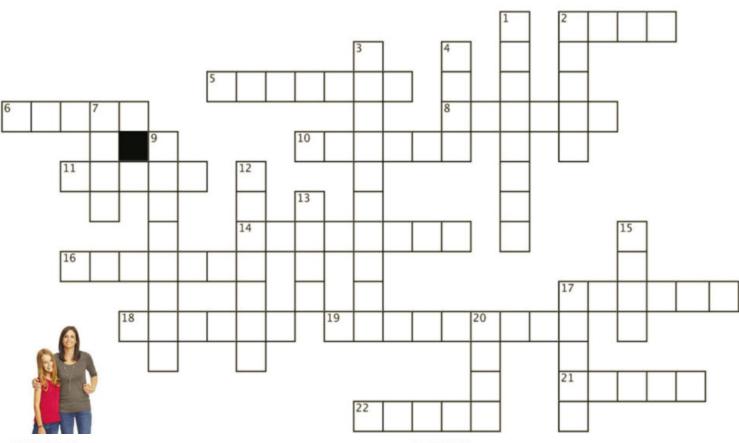

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Why I Walk - by Brenda McGee



This past year was a hard one for me as I lost my Dad, Jim, who was the namesake of my Walk to End Alzheimer's team - "Jims Millions." I named the team this in honor of the millions of dollars that we want to raise to fight Alzheimer's and other dementia so no one else has to go through the struggles with this disease like my family did. I was lucky, my Dad recognized me most days when I visited him at the care facility where he lived, but it was a struggle watching him lose his battle with this devastating disease – and knowing that 1 in 3 seniors will die with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia. I'm hoping it hasn't impacted your family

or friends yet, but I'm afraid that the day is coming when everyone will have a loved one fighting this disease.

Do you know that Alzheimer's is a disease that impacts many people - in fact, right here in Mercer County, there are 800 individuals living with the disease.

The Alzheimer's Association is leading the fight against Alzheimer's and other dementia and is committed to helping those in our community. We offer many free and local resources including Education programs, Care Consultations, and Caregiver Support Group.

A support group is currently being held on the second Wednesday of each month at the Mercer County Council on Aging in building 3 from 3 pm to 4pm and is led by Brenda McGee the event chair for the Grand Lake Walk.

Affordable Connectivity Program

ACP discounts are ending soon.

What's happening?

Due to a lack of additional funding from Congress, the FCC must wind down the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP).

Households enrolled in the ACP will continue to receive the full discount on their internet service through April 2024.

What does this mean for me?

After the ACP ends, you will no longer get the monthly internet discount or save on a device.

What do I do now?

- Please contact your internet company if you have questions about how the end of the ACP will affect your monthly bill and to ask about the options available to you.
- Check your email to see if you received a notice to recertify your existing benefit. If so, complete the process so you can keep your benefit until the ACP ends. If you don't respond, you may lose your benefit before the funding runs out.

Please visit <u>AffordableConnectivity.gov</u> for more information and for further updates regarding your ACP benefit.

Can I still save on internet service even after the ACP ends?

Yes, you may still qualify for the <u>Lifeline Program</u> to save on internet service. Lifeline is another federal program that makes phone and internet service more affordable.

If you qualify for Lifeline, you can get a monthly benefit of:

- Up to \$9.25 off the cost of phone, internet, or bundled services
- Up to \$34.25 off the cost of phone, internet or bundled services if you live on Tribal Lands

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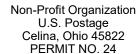
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THE MERCER COUNTY COUNCIL ON AGING
