Just Our Soldiers' Helpers (JOSH) is a woman-founded and led, IRS Approved 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization located in Central Florida. Our all-volunteer organization has shipped over 150,000 pounds of products to service members deployed to harm's way locations since 2011.

JOSH consistently achieves top rank ratings at GreatNonprofits and GuideStar because of our financial transparency and commitment to maximizing resources for care packages while minimizing operating expenses. In 2021, nearly 87% of donations went to program-related expenses.

ORIGIN STORY

In 2010, Kathy's nephew, U.S. Army Captain Josh Kinsel, deployed to Combat Outpost (COP) Wilderness in Afghanistan. Before his departure, Kathy promised to send CPT Kinsel a care package every

month of his deployment. What started off as a simple gesture of support for her nephew grew into something larg-

er as Kathy learned more about the austere conditions in which frontline U.S. Service Members live and

operate.

Service members receive just the barest of necessities during their deployment. Creature comforts only come in the form of care packages from home since forward operating units Kathy Hewitt with her nephew Captain do not have access to post/base exchanges (PX/ Josh Kinsel after his deployment. BX) where they can purchase these items.



Once Kathy became aware of this situation, she committed herself to try and make a difference in the lives of these heroes. What began as a promise to send twelve care packages quickly grew into something much larger as Kathy started shipping more care packages to CPT Kinsel's unit.

The magnitude of the effort quickly showed that establishing a charitable organization was the only way to sustain Kathy's heart's wishes. With her husband's and friends' support, and encouraging words from her nephew, "Kat, don't forget about the guys still over there," JOSH was born to improve the morale of all those fighting for our freedom and safety.

THE JOSH DIFFERENCE

Three factors combine to set JOSH apart from other care package organizations. These are **what** we ship, **when** we ship, and **where** we ship. Let's consider each of these factors separately.

What We Ship

JOSH views every care package as a gift to show our love and appreciation to service members for the sacrifices they make for our country. JOSH shows this appreciation by only shipping **full size**, **name brand** products. We do not ship hotel, travel, or sample size items or generic items. We ship items we would want to receive if we were thousands of miles from home.

Each care package consists of a USPS flat rate box meticulously packed to fill in all available space. JOSH also ships food and hygiene products separately to maintain smell and flavor integrity. This lesson was learned early on as Josh said, "Things taste a little funky when you mix the food and hygiene together, Aunt Kathy."

The following tables depict examples of items included in typical food and hygiene care packages. Representative quantities and average unit costs are also included, along with the price to ship each package.

When We Ship

Our appreciation extends beyond the traditional annual holiday recognitions. To that end, JOSH ships care packages **every month** of the year. Registered service members receive at least one care package a month from JOSH for the entire length of their deployment. If we know that the service member is sharing their items with other members in their unit, JOSH will try to send multiple care packages to that service member.

Where We Ship

JOSH primarily ships to service members deployed to front-line locations. While operations have ceased in Afghanistan we are still shipping to Service Members in Iraq, the Horn of Africa, and other undisclosed locations. We also ship to chaplains who will provide items to personnel that are in need of a morale boost.





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do service members get on the mailing list?

Service members sign up using the "Register Here" button at GoJOSH.org. After confirming the APO location is that of a forward operating area, we ship the service member a single care package to confirm they can receive it. Then we ship to them monthly until they come home.

Who can be added to your mailing list?

We ship to active-duty service members from all military branches who are deployed to remote locations with an APO or FPO address. We will also ship to deployed service members who do not receive mail from home and need a morale boost.

How much do service members pay to get care packages?

Zero. Nada. Nothing. It costs a service member nothing to receive our care packages. They are fully funded and paid for by our fundraising efforts. They are a gift to show our appreciation for their service and sacrifice.

Do we only ship to service members from Central Florida?

While we love to ship to service members deployed from our area, it is not a requirement. Typically, we do not even know the home states of service members requesting our care packages.

Do we share addresses from our service members?

No. We receive requests from our service members without any implied consent to share their information. As a result, we do not provide address information to 3rd party requests.

What do we need most?

Monetary donations are the best way to support JOSH. Since we pack boxes in an assembly line process, we need anywhere from 60 to 320 of the same type and size of an item each month to maximize our ability to support as many service members as possible. The monetary donations make it so we can buy items in bulk, saving time and money.

JOSH Volunteers on a care package assembly line. This process allows JOSH to maximize the space used in each care package. Since JOSH uses flat rate shipping boxes from the USPS, filling each package to its capacity makes sense. Plus the service members love it.





PREPPING AND PACKING EVENTS

The primary interface for our supporters and volunteers is through product prepping and packing events. These events provide a hands-on opportunity for supporters to see and feel the quantity and quality of items that make their way into every care package.

Prepping events are for sorting, counting, taping, and bagging care package items in the lead-up to a packing event. This ensures we have the right quantity of items and that they do not ruin the contents in the care package if they leak during shipping.

At packing events, prepared items are prearranged in bins along an assembly line. Packers place the materials in the correct location and orientation in each flat rate shipping box to maximize the contents and minimize wasted space.


FUNDRAISING EFFORTS


JOSH cannot exist without the devoted, faithful, and passionate support of corporate and private donations. We support as many service members as our funding allows and strive to be good stewards of our contributors' hardearned money. In 2021 nearly 87% of all donations went directly towards program costs for purchasing, storing, and shipping care packages and less than 3% went towards administrative costs. Please see the Financial section of this prospectus for more details.

While support comes in many forms including donations on our website and 3rd party events, by far, our largest single fundraising event is the JOSH Gala. For the past three years, the JOSH Gala has provided JOSH with most of its annual operating budget. The 2020 Gala, which occurred the week before the COVID-19 shutdown in March, was the only significant fundraising event in 2020. As a result, JOSH has scaled back the number of packages sent monthly.

Eighteen months later, we were able to successfully schedule and execute the JOSH Masquerade Ball in September 2021 (pictured opposite) where we raised over \$70,000. This financial achievement is not possible without the support of corporate sponsors that make up a significant percentage of our income. 
