NIGHT BEFORE COURT

- Review your ticket, charge, and court location.
- Organize evidence and make three copies.
- Decide your goal: dismissal, reduction, or supervision.

WHAT TO BRING

- Ticket and paperwork.
- Evidence and copies.
- Pen and paper.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE

- Arrive early and check in with the clerk.
- Observe other cases quietly.

WHEN YOUR CASE IS CALLED

- Stand and address the judge respectfully.
- Speak slowly and answer only what is asked.

IF YOU GO TO TRIAL

- The State presents first.
- Listen carefully and take notes.
- Cross-examine with short yes/no questions.

WHAT TO SAY – SAMPLE SCRIPTS

When your case is called:

“Good morning, Your Honor.”

Entering a plea:

“Not guilty, Your Honor.”

Requesting supervision:

“Your Honor, if the Court is inclined to find me guilty, I respectfully request court supervision.”

Closing statement:

“Your Honor, the State has not met its burden of proof. I respectfully request a finding of not guilty.”

IMPORTANT: Do not add extra words. Silence is often better than explanation.

PHRASES TO AVOID

X “I was speeding but...” **X** “I didn’t mean to...” **X** “Everyone does it...” **X** “I feel like...”

SAFE PHRASES

✓ “Yes, Your Honor.” **✓** “No, Your Honor.” **✓** “I do not recall.” **✓** “I respectfully disagree.”
