The Pastor's Pen



We live in the Age of Apology. When a public figure messes up, he or she issues an apology through social media. For example, a quick message could be posted on Twitter (X) or Instagram, saying, "I recognize that a comment I made could be misconstrued. I did not mean to upset anyone and I apologize." Anybody could read these posts, and those who may have been hurt could accept the apology or not.

I once read an article saying that such apologies are hardly believable. They seem inauthentic. It is as though they are posted quickly to reconnect to fans and keep them as fans without interruption. Celebrities cannot lose the people who purchase their music and concert tickets. Another part of the inauthenticity comes from the fact that celebrities don't just apologize to their fans but also to their sponsors who are paying them loads of money. Lose the sponsors and lose the income, so apologize as soon as possible to keep the money rolling in.

Apologizing over social media can seem contrite or connived. People will accept such postings as they see fit. It is same in the "real world." We hurt someone's feelings and we apologize, and the person may accept it or not. Yet in the real world we can continue to show ourselves to be contrite by reconnecting with people on a personal level. We don't have smartphones or Internet to separate us. There is only the air between us and the kind words and actions with which to fill it.

Henri Nouwen is one of those spiritual gurus who was big into community. It was important to him to connect with people as often as he could. He could easily lock himself in a room and write books all day. He could separate himself from others by talking to them on a stage. What was most important, however, was connecting with people, standing next to them, sharing joys and concerns, giving and receiving care. Nouwen took this so seriously that he joined a small community near Buffalo, NY, where he cared for mentally and physically handicapped men and women, feeding them, bathing them, dressing them, talking and laughing with them.

When it comes to apologizing, for Nouwen it is all about community. He even said that forgiveness "is the cement of community life. Forgiveness holds us together through good and bad times, and it allows us to grow in mutual love." In our communities, there is a willingness to accept an apology as well as to give an apology. We know that we are not perfect and that we may mess up from time to time. In fact, we could mess up so badly as to break apart community. That's how bad our sinning could be. Yet, we understand with open hearts. We acknowledge our brokenness, and we still choose to stay together as imperfect people.

The article above admitted that apologizing over social media could smooth things over between people (even between celebrities and fans). It is not the only way we should express our regrets, though. A community cannot remain together only through smartphones and the Internet. We need to see each other. We need to be with each other. In good times and in bad times, we choose to work on our relationships and keep them growing with more love and support.

Say you're sorry, when it is needed. Accept someone's "I'm Sorry." Keep the community strong.


