The Pastor's Pen



"That's somebody else's mail." This is what Brent A. Strewn was told on his way to work (*Lies My Preacher Told Me: An Honest Look at the Old Testament*, 3). ¹ He and his friend would commute to the seminary at which they both worked, and one day his friend just flat out told him that the Old Testament is "somebody else's mail," and so we shouldn't have to bother with it as Christians.

The comment caught Strewn off-guard because he is an Old Testament professor, but also because he believes the New Testament stands on equal footing as the Old. Both should be read. We cannot ignore the Old and think that our entire Bible only includes the New. To dismiss the one would not give us the full picture of who God or who we are. Strewn remembers how he responded to his friend: "So, you live in Corinth, Tom?" (page 4). He suggested that Paul's letters to the Corinthians couldn't possibly be written to him, because he did not live in Corinth at the time of their writings, and so Tom should just ignore those two letters of the New Testament.

The point Strewn is trying to make is that all the writings of the Old and New Testaments cannot be seen as somebody else's mail. It is our mail, "addressed to us, eminently useful to us" (page 8). He highlights 2 Timothy 3:16-17 as the passage to support his argument, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." For the Jews at that time it would have meant only the books of the Old Testament, but for us it now includes the Gospels and the Letters of the New Testament. All of those words (around 783,000 of them) become God's letter to us. Each story could be used to teach us much about God's love for us. Each lesson could be used to train us in understanding God's will for us.

Not every story and instruction in the Old Testament might apply to us, especially when it comes to offering sacrifices on the altar of God, but even they can tell us something about how we should carry ourselves as God's children. Even those so-called irrelevant stories are God's word to us. We can look at the unfaithfulness of Israel walking through the wilderness, for example, and receive a lesson of how we need to be faithful to God. We can listen to the prophets implore the people to turn from false gods, and we can look at the false images and ideas we have fashioned for ourselves that have nothing to do with God. They may even work against God and God's word. We grow in faith and equip ourselves for ministry from all the stories and commands and wisdom that come from both Old and New Testaments. "Whatever was written in the past," Paul says, "was written for our instruction so that we could have hope through endurance and through the encouragement of the scriptures" (Romans 15:4).

Maybe you tend to ignore the Old Testament and maybe you don't. Regardless, it is God's mail to us. God breathed it all for us to read and ingest. God intimately offers us his word, so that we may know our God better and we may also know each other better. Don't forget to open that mail and get some needed guidance.




