The Pastor's Pen



"I Started a Joke" is a song written and performed by The Bee Gees in 1968, and the Pet Shop Boys was one of the groups to cover it. This was the cover I heard while watching a certain miniseries on Prime Video, and it kept echoing in my head. It became an intriguing earworm partly because I know only a few Pet Shop Boys songs and this was not one of them, and partly because I never knew The Bee Gees wrote it in the first place.

Since I couldn't get rid of the song, I chose to look up the words to get a better feel for it. Basically, what it states is that words have meaning. They have the power to build up and tear down, and sadly many times we use words to tear down. We might not realize it — we might think we were just telling a joke - but those words might cause irreparable harm to a person. And then, we realize that we are damaged, too. The joke is turned on us and we become sad, injured people.

Paul says in his letter to the Ephesians, "Let no evil talk come out of your mouths but only what is good for building up, as there is need, so that your words may give grace to those who hear" (4:29). The Greek word for *evil* means "corrupt" or "rotten," and it is usually applied to rotting fruit or vegetables. Imagine fruit just sitting there on the table, turning brown, smelling foul, and attracting flies. The wrong word shared could turn a relationship rotten. It could corrupt a person in such a way as to make them feel rotten. Their words, thoughts, and actions might eventually turn rotten. And then what do our rotten words do to us? What we do, think, and say might become rotten, and we are no good for anybody.

Jesus says in Matthew 7:18, "A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a bad tree bear good fruit." If we had a bad fruit tree in our garden, obviously we would cut it down. What is the point of having it? But if a tree bears good fruit, we nurture it. We water it and fertilize it and prune it, making sure that each fruit that grows, year in and year out, is delightful and tasty. Imagine doing what we can to make sure our relationships are delightful. We do this by bearing the right words (as well as the right actions). We cultivate our relationships and keep them growing in love for many years to come. Adding Paul's words above, we care to build people up with the right kinds of words. They then feel special, unique, even blessed. Our words can do a lot of good for those who hear the wrong (kinds of) words every day.

Frederick Buechner says in Wishful Thinking: A Seeker's ABC, "In Hebrew the term dabar means both 'word' and 'deed.' Thus to say something is to do something. I love you. I hate you. I forgive you. I am afraid. Who knows what such words do, but whatever it is, it can never be undone. Something that lay hidden in the heart is irremovably released through speech into time, is given substance and tossed like a stone into the pool of history, where the concentric rings lap out endlessly" (pg. 120-121). That brings us back to the song above that I couldn't get rid of (it is gone now, thankfully!). Even The Bee Gees and the Pet Shop Boys understood that what we say has lasting effects. Those effects could spread and multiply and either destroy many people or build them up. It is our hope that if we are to drop stones in the pool of history, they would be good ones, filled with supportive and compassionate words.

Our words have meaning. Never underestimate our words, no matter how old or young we are. What we say matters. What we post matters. What we vocalize has great power to influence many. "Words are power," Buechner says, "essentially power of creation. By my words I both discover and create who I am. By my words I elicit a word from you. Through our converse we create each other" (page 121).


Father's Day Breakfast






