THE PASTOR'S PEN (



"If you build it, they will come" is a common theme in the 1989 movie Field of Dreams. Iowa corn farmer Ray Kinsella, played by Kevin Costner. hears voices telling him to turn part of his field into a major-league baseball diamond. When he does, legendary players from the Chicago White Sox arrive.

It is a common theme that a church might take as its own. If we plan a church event, people will automatically come, we might think. If we have a Sunday School class or Life Group, youth and adults will just show up. If we want volunteers for VBS or Kids' Club, all we need to do is make a general announcement and expect them to be there. Although the phrase "if you build it. they will come" worked in one movie, it does not necessarily work in the church. To assume that people will come to an event when the church plans one, and to assume that people will volunteer without having to be asked, is not only a misguided idea but also an unbiblical one.

We need to ask people to come and/or help. If we want people to join us in ministry, we have to go to them personally. We approach them with an invitation that they can either accept or reject. Many of us love to have people ask for our help or to join them in an event. When they do, we feel like they care about us. Their invitations tell us that they appreciate our talents and time. That person thought of us personally and is addressing us directly. It is hard to reject such kindness. General announcements might be easier, but they give us more permission to say no. We feel more compelled to let someone else show up.

What would have happened if Jesus assumed he was going to have twelve disciples? Consider Jesus just making a general announcement one day: "Hey y'all, I got ministry for anybody, if you're interested." Would anybody have shown up? Would anybody have cared about what Jesus had to offer, if he just sat in one place and waited for disciples to arrive? Instead, Jesus asked 12 men to follow him. He personally invited them into ministry. He went in search for them; he didn't expect them to find him. Upon being called, they dropped everything and followed (see Matthew 4:18-22).

Jesus did the same thing with those whom he healed and taught. He didn't stay in a synagogue or a house all day and expect people to appear. He visited their towns and homes. He visited them on the road, in foreign lands, and amid tombstones in order to give them his message of hope and life (see Mark 1:21-28, Mark 5:1-20, and John 4:1-42). Jesus never stayed put for too long – neither did Paul or the other disciples, for that matter – because he didn't assume that being the Savior would attract people to him. He went out and revealed his grace and power, and lives were transformed.

Let us follow Christ's example. Let us not be stationary bullhorns calling out to people – let us go directly to them and invite them to participate in ministry. Do not hesitate. The person we speak with may accept us or reject us. Either way, we made the effort to connect with that person personally and let him or her know how important he or she is. Ask and see what happens. By doing so, we may encounter more volunteers and more friends, with whom we may share more experiences.




Little Angels Christian Academy Joins Us


