The Pastor's Pen



Do you like interruptions? If you are like me, you probably don't.

When I am focused on writing a sermon, or even a Pastor's Pen, the last thing I need is for something or someone to break my concentration. When I am driving to a place I cannot find, I need to pay close attention to the GPS and not miss a turn that I should make. When I am fighting the final boss in a videogame, please do not interrupt me. I will not press Pause, because this bad guy must be vanquished posthaste! We may all agree that we do not like to be interrupted. In our work or play, even in our sleep, we do not need to stop and address some other thing. It is annoying. It is difficult to get back to what we were doing, especially if it is sleeping.

You know by now that my spiritual guru is Henri J.M. Nouwen, the Dutch Catholic priest, professor, writer, and theologian who was known for writing the book *The Wounded Healer*. He says that he once met an old professor at the University of Notre Dame, and they were talking about his teaching career. The professor said with a funny twinkle in his eyes: "I have always been complaining that my work was constantly interrupted until I slowly discovered that my interruptions were my work." He realized that his normal, day-to-day work was important, but what was equally important, if not more so, was when he was interrupted. Nouwen didn't give any specific instances, but we could assume some of those interruptions included a student popping by with a troubling question, having extended coffee breaks with colleagues, or exploring a spontaneous topic in class that he did not plan.

Nouwen says, "That is the great conversion in our life: to recognize and believe that the many unexpected events are not just disturbing interruptions of our projects, but the way in which God molds our hearts and prepares us for his return. When our good plans are interrupted by poor weather, our peace of mind by inner turmoil, our hope for peace by a new war, our desire for a stable government by a constant changing of the guards, and our desire for immortality by real death, we are tempted to give in to a paralyzing boredom or to strike back in destructive bitterness. But when we believe that patience can make our expectations grow, then fate can be converted into a vocation, wounds into a call for deeper understanding, and sadness into a birthplace of joy." An interruption may not sidetrack us but give us a new opportunity to serve others. A distraction may not break our concentration but make us concentrate on the vital thing God wants us to do right now.

Think about the many times Jesus was interrupted. Ministry would happen not just in certain locations but also along the way to those locations (ex. Matthew 8:1-13 and Luke 7:11-17). Ministry would happen whether he planned for it or not (ex. Mark 2:1-12 and John 8:1-11). Sometimes it is like that for us: we choose a certain path, because it is what we normally do or because we choose it on a certain day, but then God shows us another way to go. We must follow it. It is an interruption, and we should interrupt our regularly scheduled program to use our efforts in the best ways. We find those "side streets" are just important in our ministry. Maybe we soon realize the interruptions are our main ministry.




We will be hanging the greens after worship November 23. Come help us deck the hall for the celebration of Jesus' birth! Your help is needed!


