The Pastor's Pen



DID YOU KNOW that the time between Thanksgiving and Christmas is never the same every year?

The shortest length of time was back in 2019 with only 27 days between the two holidays. This year it is a full month (30 days). The longest time between Thanksgiving and Christmas is 32 days, which will happen in 2023. Maybe you have noticed that Christmas seems to come quicker in some years than in others. Some years offer less time to purchase gifts, decorate homes, and organize parties.

Those who do not fare well during Advent and Christmas may notice the lengthening and shortening of days, since now is usually a rough time for them. They may wish to get this season over and done with as soon as possible. It could be a number of factors: loss of loved family and friends, pressures at work or school or home, lack of finances, frustration with the commercialism of Christmas, lack of sunlight due to the days diminishing, and so forth. They would like to enjoy Advent but they cannot. They would like to have some emotion other than sadness and misery, but they just cannot escape what they think and feel. "It's the most wonderful time of the year," one Christmas song says, yet some might resonate with another song that goes, "I got evenings to spare that nobody will share, I guess there ain't no Santa Claus."

Be more mindful of such folks this time of year. Notice when they don't seem to have the "holiday spirit," and ask how they are faring. If you know them well enough, you might be able to pull something out that is bugging them. Prepare to spend time in listening to their stories. Try to understand where they are coming from, and be there for them in any way you can. Tell them that you are around to talk to, to vent, to cry, and to do whatever it takes to help them through. Be more mindful of those who are struggling, and let them know they are not alone.

For those struggling, I found two websites, Mayo Clinic and Seattle Christian Counseling, that both suggest expressing feelings during the holidays.² If there has been a loss, acknowledge it. If something gets you down about Advent and Christmas, it is okay to feel it. Acknowledge those feelings and thoughts to yourself, and then share with people you trust. Another suggestion is to take a breather. Do something unrelated to Advent and Christmas: read the books you like, listen to the music you enjoy, take walks and detach for a moment from the holiday. One more suggestion is to reach out to others. As stated above, we are not alone in how we feel about the holidays. In our struggles we can serve others in their suffering. Go as far as volunteering at our Food Pantry or visiting a soup kitchen, or just connecting with a relative or friend whom you know is struggling like you are.

Advent and Christmas is never supposed to be a depressing time. It is a time of rebirth. It is a time when a Baby comes to live with us, a vulnerable innocent looking for our care, desiring our compassion. We welcome Jesus into our hearts, fresh and alive. We ask Him to give light to the struggles, to fill our empty spaces, to make us whole so that we can celebrate Him and Him alone. In our struggles, Jesus is with us. He has abundant life for us, so that we can make it through any holiday or normal time. Jesus is able to "rebirth" us – He does so every day – so that we may glorify God and enjoy God forever.


