

#### **Astro Vettes**

In 1969 a General Motors dealer in Melbourne, Florida worked a deal where the three Apollo 12 astronauts could each lease a 1969 Corvette for \$1.00 per year for one year. The three astronauts were Richard Gooden, Pete Conrad and Alan Bean. As you might recall, Alan Bean recently passed away at age 86. They were to turn the cars back in after one year.

The three Astro Vettes were all identical They were Riverside Gold with the addition of what they call wings which were painted black. Certainly one of a kind. As well, they all had 427 big block engines, which were rated at 390 HP at 5400 RPMs. It would do 0 to 60 MPH in 6 seconds.

In 1971 Danny Reed, a Corvette enthusiast found an Astro Vette on a used car lot in Austin, Texas. They were being sold on a closed bid basis. Reed looked up the retail price which was \$3,200.00 and added \$30.00 to the bid. Months later he was told he was out bid with a figure of \$13,000.00. Later is was called again and told that the winning bidder could not come up with the money and the Reed could have the car for his original bid.

There is no history on the other two Astro Vettes as having been registered and it is assumed that they have been destroyed. The estimated value of the only surviving Astro Vette is in the seven figure area.

Only two of the ZL-I Corvettes made in 1969 that were equipped with a 427 aluminum engine were sold to the public. The price tag may have had something to do with it. While a normally priced Corvette cost \$4,781 in 1969, the ZL-I with its aluminum engine cost \$10,048 and had neither a radio or air-conditioning.

#### **Trout Lake Oatmeal Chocolate Chip Cookies**

2 cups butter	4 cups flour	3 cups slivered almonds
2 cups brown sugar	2 tsp baking powder	2 cups old fashion rolled oasts
2 cups white sugar	2 tsp salt	3 cups granola mix
4 eggs	2 tsp baking soda	orange zest to taste
2 tsp vanilla	I cup chocolate chips	I cup baking M & Ms

Blend butter, brown sugar and white sugar until creamy. Add eggs and vanilla. Sift dry ingredients together and then add to mixture.. Stir in chocolate chips, M & Ms, nuts, oats, granola, and orange zest.

When mixed, shape into golf ball size and bake on ungreased baking sheet at 375 degrees for 8-10 Minutes until barely golden. Best when slightly under cooked and served warm from the oven. Makes lots!! Dough keeps well in the frieg so can be baked when needed.

Note: I used self-rising flour and cut baking powder/soda in half. I also forgot the orange zest and they were still very good. Sande B.
