

GM Cancels C8 Corvette Training for Techs and Sales People at Spring Mountain Over Coronavirus Concern

General Motors appears to be taking the proactive approach by limiting employees' risk of exposure to the coronavirus as larger gatherings are now being canceled. Once we saw that Cadillac canceled the much-anticipated Lyric EV reveal scheduled for April 2nd in Los Angeles, it appears the writing is on the wall in terms of GM scaling back its participation in live events even if it means delaying the reveal of their new EV platform.

For Chevrolet dealerships to be <u>qualified for C8 Corvette sales and service</u>, they have to purchase the required tools (\$1,500), complete the training, and then send a salesperson out to Spring Mountain for \$3,500. Dealers can also elect to be a signature dealer which allows them to send a service manager or technician as well.

Currently, All Ron Fellows Performance Driving Schools will go on as scheduled at Spring Mountain Motor Resort and Country Club. Should anything change, we'll have it for you.
